<p>Sports pavilion. c1930s. Red brick in English bond, render and clay tile roof. Two storey building with 'U' plan to the pavilion element which sits raised above changing rooms and other ancillary accommodation - two projecting wings with a central range set back with a continuous glazed veranda between wings. Flight of steps to south elevation provides direct access to the pitch. Changing rooms at ground floor accessed from north elevation. Casement windows - some original metal casement windows and some replacement uPVC windows.
