Long symmetrical range to Gallwey Road with extensions to rear and projecting bays to roadside; central entrance and two flanking wings all gabled to Gallwey Road. Single-storey. Red brick in stretcher bond. uPVC replacement windows with cambered brick arches. Chimney stack to the east end has been lost. Historical Context:

Drawings in the NMR for the Army Signalling School are dated 1895 and signed by William Pitt RE. An extension was built in 1908 to provide a canteen; a use still retained to the present day.

This building is an important part of the Gallwey Road group which includes Fitzwygram House to the west and makes a positive contribution to the character and appearance of the conservation area. Architecturally, the building is striking and well considered with a strong symmetrical composition to the roadside, let down only by the loss of a chimney at the east end.
