<p>Church. 1907 by Sir Thomas Graham Jackson of London with additions of 1964. Nave, chancel, south porch. Buttressed 6-bay with 6, 2-light hipped casement dormers to both roof slopes. Red brick in English bond with ashlar dressings and plain clay tile roof. 1964 chancel in matching brick in stretcher bond. Large west door with decorative arch, west gable bell-cote, south porch gabled timber-framed with herringbone brick noggin. Flowing tracery west window with lattice glazing. Stained glass east window 1964 by Margaret Treherne. Nave arcades supported on Oregon Pine columns. Red brick churchyard walls.</p> <p>Forms group with Church Hall (also Locally Listed).</p>

Historical Context:

Sir Thomas Graham Jackson, 1st Baronet RA (21 December 1835 – 7 November 1924) was a notable architect well known of his generation. A former pupil of Sir George Gilbert Scott. He was prolific in Oxford designing for Oxford Military College as well as the University, notably: the Examination Schools, most of Hertford College (including the Bridge over New College Lane), much of Brasenose College, a range at Trinity College, and the Acland Nursing Home in North Oxford. Much of his career was devoted to the architecture of education and he worked extensively for various schools, notably Giggleswick and Brighton College. Jackson designed the former town hall in Tipperary Town, Ireland. He also worked on many parish churches and the college chapel at the University of Wales, Lampeter. He is also famous for designing the chapel (amongst other things) at Radley College. Many of his buildings are listed, some at II*. The red brick grade II listed 1908-9 Temple Speech Room at Rugby School and 1909 St Luke's Church, Wimbledon Park are useful for comparison.
