<p>Medical Officer's Quarters. 1901. 'L' Plan with main range offset but fronting Hospital Road and north-south range to the rear. Red brick in English bond with hipped slate roof with red clay ridge tiles and spear finials and projecting bracketed eaves. Symmetrical brick ridge chimney stacks. Two storey. Seven windows to principal elevation with a central section of three windows projecting forward. To one side of the projecting bay the main entrance with arch canopy on decorative brackets, to the other a canted bay window with curved roof and bracketed eaves. Asymmetrical fenestration to ground floor but symmetrically grouped to first floor 2:3:2. All vertical sliding timber sashes with horns and glazing bars, those to the ground floor are boarded (August 2010).
