Historical Context:

Louise Margaret Hospital (named after the Duchess of Connaught, whose husband was Military Commander in Aldershot) was completed in 1897. The hospital was extended in 1926 with the Queen Mary's Wing extension. Their plan form and arrangement is significant as it forms part of the social history of hospital design through this period.

The administration block and ward blocks form an important hospital group with the Grade II listed Cambridge Hospital to the west and the Nurses' Residence to the east (locally listed). These buildings are substantially intact although in poor condition. Their association with the military camp and the adjacent Grade II listed hospital give these buildings added significance. The administration block is a particularly attractive architectural composition. For these reasons these buildings have high evidential, historical, communal and aesthetic value.
