Vitrified headers to west gable and south elevation. Top hung multi-pane casement windows with flat gauged brick arches. Weatherboarding to first floor west gable. Bay window with clay tile roof to south elevation and similar open porch supported on timber posts. Brick end stacks and large ridge stack.</p>
