<p>Courtyard of stables (E), coach house (W), laundry (S) and cottage (NW), now classroom accommodation and swimming pool. c.1860s with E range encompassing a 17th century timber-frame core. 1880s coach house (E). U plan courtyard with 1 and 2 storey ranges. Pebbledash rendered with decorative geometric band design in Roman cement. Clay tile roof with fish scale bands. Red brick stacks. Half dormers to laundry breaking through the eaves with tripartite casements with lattice lights. Coach house with 5 double entrances with original doors and ironwork. Glazed lantern canopy to forecourt on cast iron columns. Cottage with canted bay window and decorative crested bargeboards. Coach house; red brick in Flemish bond with yellow brick and ashlar dressings. New flat roofed single-storey ranges for changing rooms in pebbledash, yellow brick and ashlar. Stable block pavers to courtyard.</p> <p>A very high quality group of considerable special local architectural and historic interest.</p>

Historical Context: U Plan stables, coach house laundry and cottage built in the 1860s to serve Thomas Longman's mansion house, Farnborough Hill, designed by H. E. Kendall. The Empress Eugenie bought the property in 1880 and transformed the small country house into a palatial mansion. She was responsible for the red brick coach house. Its door had to be widened for her large carriage, the opening can be seen bricked in.

This building is included on the List of Buildings of Local Significance due to its high evidential, historic, aesthetic and community values.
