<p>Public House. Mid to late 19th century. 2-storey, 3 window main range with lower 2-bay extension (former theatre), central bay projects. Rendered with slate roof and brick stacks. Ground floor public house frontage with green glazed tiles to plinth, risers, pilasters and consoles. Inscribed tiles read 'North Camp Hotel'. Front windows interrupted by three entrance doorways with glazed and panel doors. First floor has timber vertical sliding sashes with central glazing bar with architrave and rusticated keystone. Parapet hides hipped slate roof. The former theatre range has rustication, oversize doorway with stucco voisoirs flanked by ionic columns. Fascia above which is a segmental pediment (hidden by banners at time of survey). Parapet hides roof.</p>
