<p>School. Mid 19th century with late 19th and early 20th extensions and alterations. Red brick with brick stacks and clay tile roof. Single-storey, irregular plan of gabled ranges comprising original school building and later extensions and additions. Original complex red brick in English bond with diaper work in vitrified headers. Large casement gable windows with brick or ashlar surrounds, central range (Mid 19th century) window ecclesiastical in style. Timber casements or uPVC replacements. Later brick ranges (late 19th/early 20th century and late 20th century), all gabled with varied end window fenestration. School bell in gable of main range. Girls and Boys entrances.</p>
