**Former Presbytery (to the RC church of St Michael's 1856 - lost to fire within the last 10 years). c1905. Two storey detached, main range offset to Hospital Road with extensions to the rear under parallel pitched roofs running perpendicular with central valley. Red brick in an English bond with a natural slate roof with red clay ridge tiles and spear finials and exposed rafter feet. Substantial red brick chimneys. Projecting hipped bay to front elevation with further canted bay to the ground floor. Pent roof porch on decorative timber brackets over entrance. Windows are boarded to ground floor (May 2011), first floor; casements with glazing bars under cambered brick arches.**

**Forms a group with Cambridge House (adjacent) and its outbuildings and Cambridge Military Hospital (Grade II listed).**

**Historical Context:**

St Michael's House is not present on the 1898 (1:10,560) Ordnance Survey Map but is present on the 1911 (1:2500). Believed to have been built for the as a residence of the Chaplain of the RC Church of St Michael and St Sebastian which stood on ground to the north of the house. The Grade II listed church was used for storage by the MOD and destroyed by fire within the last 20 years.

The house forms a positive group with the Locally Listed Cambridge House adjacent and the Cambridge Military Hospital opposite. Its largely in-tact appearance and its connection with the now lost RC Church of St Michael and St Sebastian give the house high evidential, historic and aesthetic significance.
