<p>Former Post Office, now offices. 1895. Red brick in stretcher bond and English bond to chimney stacks with natural slate roof with bracketed eaves. Two storeys. 'L' shaped plan with principal running parallel to Queens Avenue and former sorting office to rear. Ground floor 2 sets of tripartite sashes with fixed lights above set in elliptical arches with integral hoodmoulds and raised keystones. Moulded brick string course between ground and first floor. Chamfered corner to south-west. Timber vertical sliding sashes with glazing bars and horns. Double timber paneled doors set in enclosed red brick closed porch with moulded brick door surround with dentilled cornice and further moulded brick cornice to porch parapet. Truncated red brick stack to west elevation. '1895' brick date panel and 'VR' (Victoria Regina) panel above. Cast iron rainwater goods. Historical Context:

The South East District Headquarters group comprising; the headquarters (Grade II listed – see also list description), former Post Office, Alison and Cranbrook House, stables and Military Police Barracks forms one of the most significant and prominent groups in the military town and is located on a prominent corner of the conservation area.

These buildings vary in architectural quality with the Post Office displaying some of the most attractive features and detailing in the group, reflecting no doubt the social importance of this building in the Garrison. For this reason, the former Post Office is considered to have very high evidential, historic, aesthetic and communal value and significance.
