Historical Context:


Buildings current use as Paddy Power, a bookmaker. The building dates from the late 1850's; an early Victorian addition to the town centre. From 1859-1904 it was used as the officers of Aldershot Local Government, which then became the Urban District Council in 1894 and continued to be located here until 1904, when they moved to the new Town Hall. The building is an important example of early Victorian Aldershot and retains many of its original features externally. It forms a central place in the local history of Aldershot's local government and development of the Council.
