Historical Context:

The building is currently used as officers' quarters and was built circa 1870 as a residence for the Governor of the military prison. The building was named after the first Duke of Marlborough; John Churchill and the barracks of North Camp were collectively known as the Marlborough Lines, after the Duke. Major-General Archibald Wavell, later promoted to Field Marshal Wavell lived at the property, as did other Commanders and General Officers. During the Second World War the building was occupied by the Royal Military School of Music. After the Second World War the building was converted to officers married quarters. The property is a good example of the senior officers' houses, that originates pre 1890's.


