Historical Context:

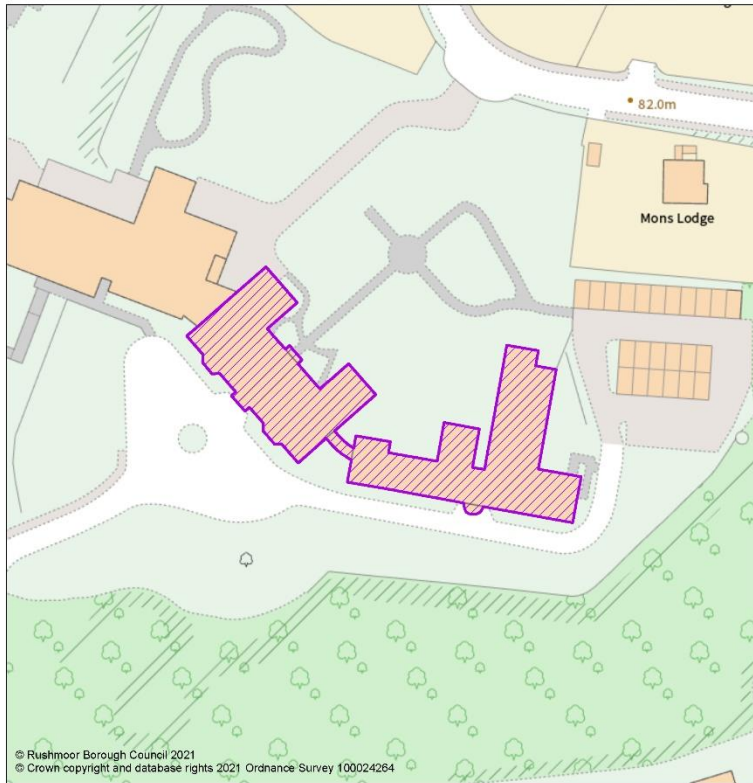
The first Mons Barracks (named after the battle of 1914 in the First World War) were opened in 1928 for units of the Royal Corps of Signals, which had been founded in 1920. From 1942-1948 Mons was an Officer Cadet Training Unit, and from 1948-1961 an Officer Cadet School. The original Mons Barracks were demolished in 1988 and the Officers' Mess is the only building remaining. Mons was particularly famous when it was the Officer Cadet School, training National Service officers, and it is important that this last link with Mons is preserved. The building is still in use as an officers' mess and the external architecture is largely original.

Criteria submitted:

C. The building or structure dates between 1914 and 1939 and has a particular quality, character or local significance.

G. The building or structure is an example of identifiable building traditions, techniques and materials that are part of the local architectural style.

I. The building or structure has special local or national historical associations.



The aim of the Local List is to preserve the features of special architectural or historic significance, and in particular those buildings (or sections of buildings) that have heritage values. The building has been extended to the West and this modern section is not therefore locally listed (as reflected by the map above). The impact of any works to the parts of the building that are not locally listed that would have an impact on the setting of the locally listed parts of the structure would be taken into consideration should any future development be proposed.
