Historical Context:

The building is detached, two-storey, gable end, with stacks and pots at either end. There is a ground floor porch/bay slate projection, with lead flashing. Sliding sash windows, with painted arches to the front elevation at first floor and two bay windows. Front door with glazed upper panel and fanlight. Slate roof with clay finial ridge. White painted timber barge boards with projecting eaves. Open front boundary to the road. Modern housing development surrounding the site. The property first appears on the 1911 ordnance survey map 1:1250, with little change over the years. The buildings is thought to be a gardeners cottage, linked to the walled garden. On the 1931 map there is an attached building, presumably a single storey store, which would account for the red paint on the west gable end. The building is in excellent structural condition, with little alteration, this with the link to the walled garden makes it a significant building.




