- (1) The retail sale / supply of alcohol;
- (2) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of live music (indoors only); and
- (3) The provision of entertainment facilities for dancing (indoors only).

Times the licence authorises the carrying out of licensable activities

- (1) The retail sale / supply of alcohol:-
 - On weekdays, other than Christmas Day, Good Friday or New Years Eve
- 11:00am to 00:00midnight.
 - On Sundays, other than Christmas Day or New Years Eve
- 12:00noon to 23:30pm.
 - On Good Friday, 12:00 noon to 23:30pm.
 - On Christmas Day – 12:00noon to 23:30pm.
 - On New Year's Eve, except on a Sunday – 11:00am to 00:00midnight.
 - On New Years Eve on a Sunday – 12:00noon to 23:30pm.
 - On New Years Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Years Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).

- (2) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of live music on Monday's, Wednesday's, Friday's and Saturday's – 19:00pm to 23:00pm only.
- (3) The provision of entertainment facilities for dancing on Saturday's – 19:00pm to 23:00pm only.

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-
 - (i) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (ii) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- (1) Intoxicating liquor may be supplied on the premises only to persons who are taking table meals there and as an ancillary to that meal.
- (2) Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.
- (3) The above restriction does not prohibit:-
 - (i) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the consumption of the alcohol on the premises:
 - (ii) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
 - (iii) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
 - (iv) consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (4) Suitable beverages other than intoxicating liquor (incl. Drinking water) shall be equally available for consumption with or otherwise as an ancillary to meals served in the licensed premises.
- (5) The premises must be bona fide used for the purpose of habitually providing the customary main meal at midday or in the evening, or both, for the accommodation of persons frequenting the premises.
- (6) Children not accompanied by an individual aged 18 or over shall not be permitted in or to remain on the premises.
- (7) Anyone authorised to sell or supply alcohol at the premises shall request and ensure sight of suitable identification, for proof of age, of any person appearing to them to be under the age of 18 (eighteen) and who is attempting to purchase alcohol. The sale of alcohol shall not be permitted to any such individual where appropriate proof is not produced.
- (8) A suitable and sufficient list of emergency contact details of local services (including the police) shall be displayed on the premises and be available to staff at all times.

- (9) Suitable and sufficient supplies of first aid equipment / materials must be made available to members of the public on request. Dependant on the activities, events and risks at the premises, a suitably trained first aider or an appointed person for first aid must also be present on the premises at all times during licensable activities.
- (10) Except for access and egress, all external windows and doors to the premises shall be closed and kept closed between 21:00pm and the end of opening hours on any day.
- (11) Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be suitably located on all exit doors of the licensed premises requesting patrons and staff to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
- (12) (i) No music or speech shall be relayed via external speakers or other amplification equipment other than for events with the prior approval of the licensing authority.
- (ii) All speakers and similar amplification equipment shall be kept within the premises and shall not be positioned near to or facing openings such as doors and windows.
- (iii) All speakers and amplification equipment shall be fitted on suitable anti-vibration mountings.
- (13) In all cases, amplified sound levels shall be set:-
- (i) at a level that ensures that noise from the premises is inaudible on all sides of the premises at the boundary of the nearest residential premises (see Condition 13 below); or
- (ii) at a level agreed with Environmental Health Services at Rushmoor Borough Council.
- (14) (i) The licence holder or nominated representative(s) shall carry out a regular noise assessment of the area adjacent to the premises.
- (ii) Noise assessments shall take place on all sides of the premises at the boundary of the nearest residential premises, and if audible, steps shall be taken to reduce noise from the premises to a level where noise is no longer audible at the monitoring points.
- (iii) All noise assessments shall be undertaken at hourly intervals starting from 21:00pm.
- (iv) Written records of these assessments and any remedial action taken should be kept and made available to either the local authority or the Licensing Authority when requested.

- (15) (i) A suitable noise complaints procedure must be established and in operation at the premises (e.g. all staff must be familiar with the complaints procedure and any complaint(s) made in respect of the premises, its customers, staff and/or the activities carried on there must be investigated and remedied as soon as, and, so far as is reasonably practicable to prevent public nuisance).
- (ii) Suitable written records (e.g. the nature of any complaint(s), action(s) taken in response, the date(s) and time(s) when any complaint was made, together with the name of the person(s) who handled the complaint) must be kept and made available to officers of Rushmoor Borough Council on request.
- (16) Disposal of refuse such as waste bottles into external receptacles, where the noise may be audible to neighbouring properties, shall not occur between 23:00pm and 08:00am.
- (17) All lighting, including external lighting and lights activated by sensors, shall be correctly adjusted so that it only illuminates the surface(s) intended and does not unreasonably throw light onto neighbouring property.
- (18) All staff at the premises shall be made aware of the conditions of this licence by a mechanism in writing.
