Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-
 - (i) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (ii) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- (3)
 - (i) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (ii) For the purposes of this condition, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children –
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to –
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
 - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on –

- (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process,
or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- (4) The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- (5) The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (6) (i) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (ii) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- (7) The responsible person shall ensure that –
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures –
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- (1) No licensable activities shall be undertaken except during permitted hours.
- (2) Intoxicating liquor may be sold / supplied for consumption on the premises only to persons who are taking table meals there and as an ancillary to that meal.
- (3) Anyone authorised to sell or supply alcohol at the premises shall request and ensure sight of suitable identification, for proof of age, of any person appearing to them to be under the age of 18 (eighteen) and who is attempting to purchase alcohol. The sale of alcohol shall not be permitted to any such individual where appropriate proof is not produced.
- (4) The licence holder, or nominated representative shall actively participate in any local Pubwatch / Shopwatch scheme.
- (5) The contact details of suitable and sufficient local taxi companies shall be available customers on the premises at all times.
- (6)
 - (i) No music or speech shall be relayed via external speakers / amplification systems other than for events with the prior approval of the licensing authority.
 - (ii) Except in approved circumstances, all speakers and similar amplification equipment shall be kept within the premises and shall not be positioned near to or facing openings such as doors and windows.
 - (iii) All speakers and similar amplification equipment shall be located on suitable anti-vibration mounts.
- (7)
 - (i) The licence holder or nominated representative(s) shall carry out a regular noise assessment of the area adjacent to the premises.
 - (ii) Noise assessments shall take place on all sides of the premises at the boundary of the nearest residential premises, and if audible, steps shall be taken to reduce noise from the premises to a level where noise is no longer audible at the monitoring points.
 - (iii) As a minimum, noise assessments shall be undertaken at hourly intervals starting from 22:00pm to the end of permitted hours.
 - (iv) Written records of these assessments and any remedial action taken should be kept and made available to either the local authority or the Licensing Authority when requested.
- (8)
 - (i) A suitable noise complaints procedure must be established and in operation at the premises (e.g. all staff must be familiar with the

- complaints procedure and any complaint(s) made in respect of the premises, its customers, staff and/or the activities carried on there must be investigated and remedied as soon as, and, so far as is reasonably practicable to prevent public nuisance).
- (ii) Suitable written records (e.g. the nature of any complaint(s), action(s) taken in response, the date(s) and time(s) when any complaint was made, together with the name of the person(s) who handled the complaint) must be kept and made available to officers of Rushmoor Borough Council on request.
- (9)
 - (i) Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits of the premises requesting patrons and staff to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
 - (ii) The need to leave the premises and area quietly shall, so far as is reasonably practicable, be verbally re-iterated by staff as customers leave the premises.
 - (10) Except for access and egress, all external windows and doors to the premises shall be kept closed.
 - (11) Disposal of refuse such as waste bottles into external receptacles, where the noise may be audible to neighbouring properties, shall not occur between 23:00pm and 08:00am.
 - (12) All lighting, including external lighting and lights activated by sensors, shall be correctly adjusted so that they only illuminate the surface(s) intended and do not unreasonably throw light onto neighbouring property.
 - (13) The area in the immediate vicinity of the premises shall be cleared of litter on a regular basis and always at the close of business each day.
 - (14)
 - (i) Anyone authorised to sell or supply alcohol at the premises shall request and ensure sight of suitable identification, for proof of age, of any person appearing to them to be under the age of 21 (twenty-one) and who is attempting to purchase alcohol.
 - (ii) Further to the above, anyone authorised to sell or supply alcohol at the premises shall be instructed that no sale of alcohol shall be made unless suitable identification, for proof of age, can be provided.
 - (14) Customer toilets shall be checked at hourly intervals and cleaned as necessary.
 - (15) All staff / employees shall be made aware of the conditions of this licence by a mechanism in writing.
