- (2) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of indoor sporting events (limited only to the playing of pub games and like competitions);
- (3) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of live music (indoors only);
- (4) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of recorded music (indoors only);  
and
- (5) The provision of late night refreshment (indoors only).

## Times the licence authorises the carrying out of licensable activities

- (1) The retail sale / supply of alcohol:-
  - Monday to Saturday - 11:00am to 23:00pm;
  - Sundays - 11:00am to 22:00pm; and
  - On New Years Eve (31<sup>st</sup> December) - 11:00am to 01:00am the following day.
- (2) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of indoor sporting events:-
  - Sundays - 11:00am to 22:30pm;
  - Monday to Thursday - 11:00am to 23:00pm; and
  - Fridays and Saturdays - 11:00am to 23:30pm.
- (3) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of live and recorded music:-
  - Sundays - 11:00am to 22:00pm;
  - Monday to Saturday - 11:00am to 23:00pm; and
  - On New Years Eve (31<sup>st</sup> December) - 11:00am to 01:00am the following day.
- (4) The provision of late night refreshment:-
  - On New Years Eve (31<sup>st</sup> December) - 23:00pm to 01:00am the following day.

## The opening hours of the premises

- (1) Sundays - 08:00am to 22:30pm;
- (2) Monday to Saturday - 08:00am to 23:30pm; and
- (3) On New Years Eve (31<sup>st</sup> December) - 08:00am to 01:00am the following day.

**Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions**

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-
  - (i) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (ii) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- (3)
  - (i) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (ii) For the purposes of this condition, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children –
    - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to –
      - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
      - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
    - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
    - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on –
    - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
    - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
  - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- (4) The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- (5) The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (6) (i) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (ii) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- (7) The responsible person shall ensure that –
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures –
    - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
  - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

**Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule**

- (1)
  - (i) A suitable and sufficient CCTV camera system linked to a suitable recording facility shall, so far as is reasonably practicable, be operational at the premises during any period in which licensable activities are permitted.
  - (ii) So far as is reasonably practicable, the CCTV system must be maintained in good working order at all times.
  - (iii) The CCTV system shall be checked for faults on a daily basis prior to the start of licensable activities. Any faults found in the system shall be rectified as soon as reasonably practicable. Written records of these shall be maintained and made available to the licensing authority and Hampshire Constabulary on request.
- (2) A zero tolerance approach shall be taken towards the presence and use of illegal drugs on the premises. This policy shall be actively enforced at all times and all employees shall be suitably and sufficiently trained in drug awareness.
- (3) Except for access and egress, all external doors and windows must be closed and kept closed between 21:00pm and the end of the specified opening hours on any day, or at any time when amplified music is being played.
- (4) All speakers must be kept within the premises and shall not be positioned near to or facing openings such as doors or windows. Speakers shall be placed on anti-vibration mounts.
- (5)
  - (i) All amplified sound(s) shall be played through a suitable sound-limiting device.
  - (ii) The sound level output of any sound limiting device shall be set at a level that ensures that noise from the premises is inaudible at the boundary of the nearest residential premises on all sides of the licensed premises.
- (6)
  - (i) The licence holder or a nominated representative shall carry out a regular noise assessment of the area adjacent to the premises at the boundary of the nearest residential premises whilst music is being played. Steps shall be taken to reduce noise from the premises to a level where noise is inaudible at the monitoring points.
  - (ii) These assessments shall be undertaken at hourly intervals from 21:00pm whilst music is being played. Written records of these assessments and any remedial action should be kept and made available to the local authority or licensing authority when requested.

- (7) Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits of the premises requesting patrons and staff to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
- (8) Disposal of refuse such as waste bottles into external receptacles, where the noise will be audible to neighbouring properties, shall not occur between 23:00pm and 08:00am.
- (9) All lighting including external lighting shall be correctly adjusted so that they only illuminate the surface(s) intended and do not throw light onto neighbouring property.
- (10) The area in the immediate vicinity of the premises shall be cleared of litter on a regular basis and always at the close of business.
- (11) All staff / employees shall be made aware of the conditions attached to this licence through a mechanism writing.

**Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority**

- (1) There shall be no access to the premises for patrons from Waterloo Road after 22:00pm. Notices to this effect shall be clearly displayed both inside and outside the front door to the premises.
- (2) No licensable activities or the consumption of food or drink shall be permitted in any external area(s) of the premises used by customers / patrons between 21:00pm and the end of specified opening hours on any day. Only smoking may be permitted in any authorised external area(s) of the premises during the time stated.
- (3) So far as is reasonably practicable, staff shall verbally reiterate the requirement for customers to leave the premises and surrounding area quietly when they leave the premises.
- (4) No glass vessels or open bottles shall be taken outside the front of the premises at any time.
- (5) The designated smoking area shall be situated as far as possible from the residential properties on either side of the premises.
