 - Thursday to Saturday – 08:00am to 01:00am the following day;
 - On Christmas Eve, Boxing Day, Maundy Thursday and Sundays preceding Bank Holiday Mondays – one additional hour; and
 - On New Years Eve – from the end of permitted hours to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.
- (2) The provision of late night refreshment:-
 - Sunday to Wednesday - 23:00pm to 24:00midnight;
 - Thursday to Saturday – 23:00pm to 01:00am the following day;
 - On Christmas Eve, Boxing Day, Maundy Thursday and Sundays preceding Bank Holiday Mondays – one additional hour; and
 - On New Years Eve – 23:00pm to 05:00am the following day.

The opening hours of the premises

- Sunday to Wednesday – 07:00am to 00:30am the following day;
- Thursday to Saturday – 07:00am to 01:30am the following day;
- On Christmas Eve, Boxing Day, Maundy Thursday, Sundays preceding Bank Holiday Mondays and the morning BST commences – one additional hour; and
- On New Years Eve – from the end of permitted hours to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day.

Where the licence authorises supplies of alcohol whether these are on and/or off supplies

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-
 - (i) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (ii) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- (3)
 - (i) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (ii) For the purposes of this condition, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children –
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to –
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on –
 - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
 - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
 - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- (4) The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- (5) The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (6) (i) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (ii) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- (7) The responsible person shall ensure that –
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures –
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- (1) No licensable activities shall be undertaken except during permitted hours.
- (2) Suitable and sufficient staff, including managers, shall be present when licensable activities are taking place to encourage responsible behaviour on the premises at all times.
- (3)
 - (i) A suitable and sufficient CCTV camera system linked to a suitable recording facility must be in operation at the premises during permitted hours.
 - (ii) So far as is reasonably practicable, the CCTV system shall be well maintained and in good working order at all times.
 - (iii) CCTV recordings and footage must be retained for a minimum period of 30 (thirty) days and be made available to the Police or Licensing Authority upon request (subject to the data protection legislation in force at the time).
 - (iv) All members of the management team at the premises will be conversant with the operation and retrieval of information obtained by the CCTV system.
- (4) Non-alcoholic beverages including soft drinks, water, tea and coffee shall be available at all times when the sale of alcohol is taking place.
- (5) The area in the immediate vicinity of the premises shall be cleared of litter arising from the premises or it's customers, including waste arising from smoking activities, on a regular basis, and always at the close of business each day.
- (6) No consumption of food and drink in the outside areas shall take place after 2300
- (7)
 - (i) Anyone authorised to sell alcohol at the premises shall be suitably trained and supervised in respect of the following matters to a level commensurate with their duties and responsibilities:-
 - (a) the refusal of the sale of alcohol to those who appear intoxicated;
 - (b) the steps to be taken where an individual appearing to be under the age of 21 attempts to purchase alcohol; and
 - (c) the steps to be taken where an individual attempts to purchase alcohol for another individual who appears to be under the age of 18.

- (ii) Written records of such training shall be kept and made available to either the local authority or the licensing authority on request.
- (8)
- (i) The premises licence holder shall implement a Challenge 21 policy at the premises which requires anyone authorised to sell or supply alcohol at the premises shall request and ensure sight of suitable identification, for proof of age, of any person appearing to them to be under the age of 21 (twenty-one) and who is attempting to purchase alcohol.
 - (ii) Further to the above, anyone authorised to sell or supply alcohol at the premises shall be instructed that no sale of alcohol shall be made unless suitable identification, for proof of age, can be provided
 - (iii) Suitable and sufficient warning signs shall be displayed in the premises providing information in respect of the above challenge 21 policy and the request for suitable identification in connection thereof.
- (9) Table meals shall be available at the premises at all times children are permitted on the premises.
