**Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions**

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-
- (i) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (ii) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- (3) (i) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (ii) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
    - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
    - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
  - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- (4) The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (5) (i) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (ii) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (iii) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
  - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- (6) The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
  - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
  - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
  - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.”
- (7) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- (8) (i) In respect of the exhibition of films, the admission of children (i.e. anyone aged under 18) must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation(s) made by the film classification body specified (as designated by S4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 - the British Board of Film Classification).
- (ii) Where a film classification body is not specified, the admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation(s) made by the licensing authority.

**Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule**

- (1) The licence holder or nominated representative(s) shall carry out regular noise assessments of the area adjacent to the premises at the boundary of the nearest residential premises while regulated entertainment is taking place. Steps shall be taken to reduce the level of noise where it is likely to cause a nuisance to local residents.
- (2) These assessments shall be undertaken at hourly intervals starting from 21:00hrs. Written records of these assessments and any remedial action taken shall be kept and made available to either the Local Authority or the Licensing Authority when requested.
- (3) All external doors/windows must be kept closed, other than during access/egress after 22:00pm and the end of the specified opening hours on any day.
- (4) No music or speech shall be relayed via external speakers other than for events with the prior approval of the Licensing Authority.
- (5) All speakers must be kept within the premises and shall not be positioned near to or facing openings such as doors or windows. Speakers shall be placed on anti-vibration mounts.
- (6)
  - (i) Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting patrons and staff to leave the premises and area quietly.
  - (ii) Management and staff shall take such steps as may be appropriate to ensure that members, guests and staff leave the premises and area quietly.
- (7) Disposal of refuse such as waste bottles into external receptacles where the noise may be audible to neighbouring properties shall not occur between 23:00pm and 08:00am on any day.
- (8)
  - (i) Anyone authorised to sell or supply alcohol at or on behalf of the premises shall request and ensure sight of suitable identification, for proof of age, of any person appearing to them to be under the age of 21 (twenty-one) and who is attempting to purchase alcohol.
  - (ii) All staff / employees shall be given suitable and sufficient training in relation to the lawful sale of alcohol and the above Challenge 21 policy to a level commensurate with their role and responsibilities. Written records of such training shall be kept and made available to either the local authority or the licensing authority on request.

- (9) (i) A suitable and sufficient CCTV camera system linked to a suitable recording facility shall, so far as is reasonably practicable, be operational at the premises during any period in which licensable activities are permitted.
- (ii) The CCTV system required shall incorporate sufficient cameras as to fully monitor the entrances/exits, the bars and main customer areas of the premises along with any gaming machines within the premises.
- (10) The premises shall operate in accordance with the club rules in force at the time. The premises licence holder shall notify the licensing authority of any amendments as soon as reasonably practicable.
