- (2) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of the exhibition of film(s) (limited to video entertainment on television screens and amusement machines only), (indoors only);
- (3) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of indoor sporting events (limited to the playing of pub games only);
- (4) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of live music (including Karaoke), (indoors only);
- (5) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of recorded music (including jukebox), (indoors only);
- (6) The provision of regulated entertainments of a similar description to that falling within (4) and (5) above (including pub quizzes, competitions, pub games, compere and amplified voice), (indoors only); and
- (7) The provision of late night refreshment (indoors only).

- (2) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of the exhibition of film(s) and / or the provision of indoor sporting events:-
 - Sunday to Thursday 10:00am to 23:30pm;
 - Fridays and Saturdays 10:00am to 00:30am the following day.
- (3)The provision of regulated entertainment by way of live music, recorded music and/or anything of a similar description:-
 - On any day (other than 31st December) 10:00am to 23:00pm; and
 - On 31st December 10:00am until 01:00am on the 1st of January.
- The provision of late night refreshment:-(4)
 - Sunday to Thursday: 23:00pm to 24:00midnight;
 - Friday and Saturday: 23:00pm to 01:00am the following day;
 - On 31st December 10:00am to 24:00midnight New Years Day (only if the 1st January falls on a day between Sunday to Thursday (inclusive)); and
 - On 31st December 10:00am to 01:00am on 2nd January (only if New Years Day falls on a Friday or Saturday).

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-
 - (i) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (ii) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- (3) (i) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (ii) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (iii) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- (4) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. For the purposes of this condition
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula –

P = D + (DxV)

Where -

(i) P is the permitted price



- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of (c) which there is in force a premises licence -
 - The holder of the premises licence (i)
 - (ii) The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of (d) which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) would (apart (f) from the paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- Paragraph (b)(ii) applies where the permitted price given by (g) Paragraph (b) on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to (h) sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
- (5) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (6)In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on



for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- (7) The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (8) The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and



- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
- (9) (i) In respect of the exhibition of films, the admission of children (ie: anyone aged under 18) must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation(s) made by the film classification body specified (as designated by S4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 the British Board of Film Classification).
 - (ii) Where a film classification body is not specified, the admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation(s) made by the licensing authority.



Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- (1) No licensable activities shall be undertaken except during permitted hours.
- (2) The premises shall remain open for 30 minutes following the last sale of alcohol during permitted hours. This period may be used for drinking-up and the use of lavatories only.
- (3) The maximum number of persons that may attend any booked function at the premises is **eighty (80)**. The licence holder must take such steps as may be necessary to ensure that this number is not exceeded.
- (4) The licence holder shall ensure that the rear yard of the premises (external drinking area) is closed from 22:00pm each day and patrons asked to leave the area quietly.
- (5) All external windows shall be double glazed in construction.
- (6) All external public access / egress doors shall be fitted with an acoustic lobby.
- (7) Anyone authorised to sell or supply alcohol at the premises shall request and ensure sight of suitable identification, for proof of age, of any person appearing to them to be under the age of 20 (twenty) and who is attempting to purchase alcohol. The sale of alcohol shall not be permitted to any such individual where appropriate proof (proving they are over the age of 18) is not produced.
- (8) Suitable and sufficient supplies of first aid equipment / materials must be made available to members of the public. Dependant on the activities, events and risks at the premises, a suitably trained first aider or an appointed person for first aid must also be present on the premises at all times during licensable activities.




Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

- (1) Except for access and egress, all external doors and windows must be closed and kept closed between 22:30pm and the end of the specified opening hours on any day.
- (2) Suitable and sufficient, clear and legible notices must be displayed at prominent positions within the premises requesting patrons and staff to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
