- (1) The retail sale / supply of alcohol;
- (2) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of the exhibition of film(s) (indoors only);
- (3) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of indoor sporting events;
- (4) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of performance of live music (indoors only);
- (5) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of recorded music (indoors only);
- (6) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of the performance of dance (indoors only);
- (7) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of facilities for dancing
- (8) The provision of facilities for making music (indoors only); and
- (9) The provision of late-night refreshment (indoors only).

- (1) The retail sale / supply of alcohol; the provision of regulated entertainment by way of exhibition of films, indoor sporting events, recorded music, live music, performances of dance and the provision of facilities for making music and facilities for dancing:-
  - On any day, except Christmas Day and New Year's Eve 10:00am to 00:30am the following day;
  - > On Christmas Day 11:30am to 22:30pm; and
  - > On New Year's Eve 10:00am to 00:30am on the 2<sup>nd</sup> January.
- (2) The provision of late-night refreshment:-
  - On any day, except Christmas Day and New Year's Eve 23:00pm to 00:30am the following day; and
  - On New Year's Eve 23:00am to 05:00am the following day.

## The opening hours of the premises

- (1) On any day, except Christmas Day and New Year's Eve 00:00am to 24:00midnight;
- (2) On Christmas Day 11:30am to 23:00pm; and
- (3) On New Year's Eve 10:00am until 01:00am on 2<sup>nd</sup> January.

## **Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions**

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-
  - (i) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (ii) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- (3) (i) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (ii) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
  - (iii) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
    - (a) a holographic mark, or
    - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- (4) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. For the purposes of this condition
  - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
  - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula –P = D + (DxV)

Where –

- (i) P is the permitted price
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and



- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
  - (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence
    - (i) The holder of the premises licence
    - (ii) The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
    - (iii) The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
  - (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
  - (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
  - (f) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) would (apart from the paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
  - (g) Paragraph (b)(ii) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
  - (h) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
- (5) (i) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (ii) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities,



carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
  - drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
  - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- (6) The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (7) The responsible person must ensure that—
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—



- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
- (8) (i) In respect of the exhibition of films, the admission of children (ie: anyone aged under 18) must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation(s) made by the film classification body specified (as designated by S4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 the British Board of Film Classification).
  - (ii) Where a film classification body is not specified, the admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation(s) made by the licensing authority.



### Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- (1) No licensable activities shall be undertaken except during permitted hours.
- (2) As regards the retail sale / supply of alcohol, the above restriction does not prohibit:-
  - (i) consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises or to any person bona fide residing at the adjacent hotel (as shown on the outline given at Annex 4, page 9 of this licence);
  - (ii) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there or by any person bona fide residing at the adjacent hotel (as shown on the outline given at Annex 4, page 9 of this licence):
  - (iii) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there or to any such friend of a person bona fide residing at the adjacent hotel (as shown on the outline given at Annex 4, page 9 of this licence) who, in each case, are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied;
- (3) No films or videos of any description shall be shown so that they can be viewed by persons under the age of any applicable British Board of Film Classification or local authority certification.
- (4) Suitable and sufficient supplies of first aid equipment / materials must be made available to members of the public on request. Dependant on the activities, events and risks at the premises, a suitably trained first aider or an appointed person for first aid must also be present on the premises at all times during licensable activities.
- (5) Except for access and egress, all external doors and windows must be closed and kept closed between 23:00pm and the end of the opening hours on any day.
- (6) (i) No music or speech shall be relayed via external speakers other than for events with the prior approval of the licensing authority.
  - (ii) All speakers and amplification equipment shall be kept within the premises and shall not be positioned near to or facing openings such as doors or windows.



- (iii) All speakers and similar amplification equipment shall be placed on suitable anti-vibration mounts.
- (7) (i) Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be suitably located at all exits of the premises requesting patrons and staff to leave the premises and area quietly.
  - (ii) Management and staff of the premises shall verbally request customers leaving said premises to leave the premises and area quietly.
- (8) (i) The licence holder or nominated staff representative(s) must carry out a regular noise assessment of the area adjacent to the premises whilst licensable activities are taking place.
  - (ii) Noise assessments must take place on all sides of the premises at the boundary of the nearest residential premises, and if audible, suitable and sufficient steps shall be taken to reduce noise from the licensed premises to a level at which noise from the premises is no longer audible at the monitoring point(s).
  - (iii) Such assessments shall be undertaken at hourly intervals from 23:00pm to the end of opening hours on any day.
  - (iv) Written records of these assessments and any remedial action(s) taken shall be kept and made available to either the local authority or the Licensing Authority on request.
- (9) (i) A suitable noise complaints procedure must be established and in operation at the premises (e.g. all staff must be familiar with the complaints procedure and any complaint(s) made in respect of the premises, its customers, staff and/or the activities carried on there must be investigated and remedied as soon as, and, so far as is reasonably practicable to prevent crime or disorder, public nuisance, harm to children and/or to ensure public safety).
  - (ii) Written details comprising the nature of any complaint(s), action(s) taken in response, the date(s) and time(s) when any complaint was made, together with the name of the person(s) who handled the complaint must be kept and made available to officers of Rushmoor Borough Council on request.
- (10) Disposal of refuse such as waste bottles into external receptacles, where the noise may be audible to neighbouring properties, must not occur between 23:00pm and 08:00am the following day, on any day.
- (11) Solid fencing / barriers shall be provided and maintained around all car parking areas, play areas and beer gardens.



- (12) The garden and/or external drinking area shall not be used for the consumption of alcohol between 23:00 and closing time, Monday to Sunday. The external areas can be used by customers for smoking after 23:00.
- (13) (i) All lighting including external lighting and lights activated by sensors shall be correctly adjusted so that they only illuminate the surface(s) intended and do not throw light onto neighbouring property.
  - (ii) External lights shall be provided with properly designed screens, baffles, hoods and louvers to control the beam.
  - (iii) All external lighting shall be turned off when not in use.
- (14) (i) Suitable and sufficient notices shall be displayed within the premises asking customers to dispose of litter responsibly.
  - (ii) Suitable and sufficient litterbins for the disposal of customer litter shall be provided within the premises or at the exits.
  - (iii) The area in the immediate vicinity of the premises shall be cleared of litter on a regular basis and always at the close of business.
- (15) Customer toilets shall be checked at hourly intervals and cleaned as necessary.
- (16) All employees shall be made aware of the conditions attached to this licence by a mechanism in writing.
