- (5) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of boxing or wrestling (indoors only);
- (6) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of live music (indoors only);
- (7) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of recorded music (indoors only);
- (8) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of the performance of dance (indoors only);
- (9) The provision of regulated entertainments of a similar description to that falling within (6), (7) and (8) above, (indoors only); and

**Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions**

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-
  - (i) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (ii) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- (3)
  - (i) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (ii) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
  - (iii) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
    - (a) a holographic mark, or
    - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- (4) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. For the purposes of this condition –
  - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
  - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula –
$$P = D + (D \times V)$$
Where –
    - (i) P is the permitted price
    - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence –
  - (i) The holder of the premises licence
  - (ii) The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - (iii) The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- (f) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) would (apart from the paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (g) Paragraph (b)(ii) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (h) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
- (5)
  - (i) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (ii) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
  - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
  - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- (6) The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (7) The responsible person must ensure that—
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
    - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
  - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
- (8) Where, at any specified time(s), one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity (within the meaning of the Private Security Industry Act 2001), each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority (SIA).
- (9) (i) In respect of the exhibition of films, the admission of children (ie: anyone aged under 18) must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation(s) made by the film classification body specified (as designated by S4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 - the British Board of Film Classification).
- (ii) Where a film classification body is not specified, the admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation(s) made by the licensing authority.

**Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule**

- (1) No licensable activities shall be undertaken except during permitted hours.
- (2) Patrons will not be allowed to bring open or sealed bottles of alcohol on to the premises.
- (3) A regular collection of empty or abandoned glasses shall be made.
- (4) (i) A suitable and sufficient CCTV camera system linked to a suitable recording facility shall, so far as is reasonably practicable, be operational at the premises during any period in which licensable activities are permitted.  
  
(ii) So far as is reasonably practicable, the CCTV system must be maintained in good working order at all times.  
  
(iii) CCTV recordings and footage must be retained for a minimum period of 31 (thirty-one) days and be made available for review by the Police or Licensing Authority upon request (subject to the requirements of the Data Protection legislation in force at the time).
- (5) A notice shall be displayed at the entrance to the premises stating that CCTV is in operation within the premises.
- (6) All incidents of crime and disorder at the premises will be recorded in an incident book maintained at the premises at all times.
- (7) (i) All staff / employees shall (before being permitted to make sales of alcohol) be given suitable and sufficient training in the refusal of alcohol to patrons who are drunk or disorderly. This training shall be refreshed no less than every 6 months.  
  
(ii) Written records of such training shall be kept and made available to either the Local Authority or the licensing authority on request.
- (8) (i) In all cases, only drinking vessels made from toughened glass or plastic may be used to serve drinks to customers at the premises.  
  
(ii) The Premises Licence Holder will undertake Risk Assessment to determine the times at which only polycarbonate (or equivalent) drinking vessels shall be used.
- (9) A qualified medical practitioner shall be present at the premises throughout any sporting entertainment involving boxing, wrestling, judo, karate or sport of a similar nature.



- (10) Where a ring is used for sporting entertainment it will be constructed by a competent person and shall be inspected by a competent authority before use. Furthermore, any material used to form the skirt of the ring shall be flame retardant.
- (11) Where a ring is present at the premises no members of the public will occupy any seat, which is closer than 2.5 metres to said ring.
- (12) (i) The licence holder or nominated representative(s) shall carry out a regular assessment of the area adjacent to the premises while licensable activities are taking place.
- (ii) Noise assessment shall take place on all sides of the premises at the boundary of the nearest residential premises. Steps shall be taken to reduce the level of noise where it is likely to cause a nuisance to local residents.
- (iii) These assessments shall be undertaken at hourly intervals starting from 21:00hrs.
- (iv) Written records of these assessments and any remedial action taken should be kept and made available to either the local authority or licensing authority as required.
- (v) Suitable written records of any complaints about the premises, its customers, staff and/or activities carried on there must be kept and made available to offices of Rushmoor Borough Council on request. These records should include, but not be limited to, the nature of any complaint(s), action(s) taken in response, the date(s), time(s) when any complaint was made, together with the name of the person handling the complaint.
- (13) (i) When regulated entertainment is taking place, all external doors and the internal lobby doors shall be kept closed, other than during access and egress from 22:00 hrs until the end of specified opening hours on any day.
- (iii) All external doors and internal lobby doors shall be fitted with self-closing devices.
- (iv) When regulated entertainment is taking place, all windows shall be kept closed, from 22:00hrs until the end of specified opening hours on any day.
- (14) No music or speech shall be relayed via external speakers.

- (15) Disposal of refuse such as waste bottles into external receptacles where the noise will be audible to neighbouring properties must not occur between 23:00pm and 08:00am.
- (16) (No licensable activities or the consumption of food or drink shall be permitted in any external area(s) of the premises used by customers / patrons between 22:00pm and the end of specified opening hours on any day. Only smoking may be permitted in any authorised external area(s) of the premises during the time stated.
- (17) The area in the immediate vicinity of the premises shall be cleared of litter, including waste arising from smoking activities, on a regular basis and always at the close of business on each day.
- (18) (i) Anyone authorised to sell or supply alcohol at the premises shall request and ensure sight of suitable identification, for proof of age, of any person appearing to them to be under the age of 25 (twenty-five) and who is attempting to purchase alcohol.  
  
(ii) Further to the above, all staff at the premises shall be instructed that no sale of alcohol shall be made unless suitable photographic identification for proof of age, by way of driving licence, passport and/or national ID card, can be provided.
- (19) Suitable and sufficient warning signs shall be displayed throughout the premises providing information in respect of the above challenge 25 policy and the request for suitable identification in connection thereof.
- (20) Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting patrons and staff to leave the premises and area quietly.
- (21) Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed in the smoking area requesting patrons are mindful and considerate of residents in neighbouring properties and use the area quietly after 22:00hrs.

**The following conditions shall apply for any event involving live and/or recorded music, which is not a wedding, christening (or similar event of any religion), birthday celebrations for someone under the age of 16, seated concert or function including a sit down table meal.**

- (22) The maximum number of patrons permitted into the event shall be 300.
- (23) The sale of alcohol shall cease no later than 23.30 hours.
- (24) Regulated entertainment shall cease no later than midnight.

- (25) Entry to the venue shall only be permitted by those named on a guest list or ticket purchased in advance of the event, with the numbers provided to the venue in advance of the event.
- (26) A minimum ratio of two SIA Licensed Door Supervisors per 100 persons shall be employed and in attendance (i.e. on duty) at the premises solely to carry out door supervisor/security duties for the duration of the event, until such time as all patrons are dispersed from the vicinity of the premises. Any SIA Door Supervisor on duty for dispersal at the end of the event shall wear a high visibility tabard.
- (27) A Log Book shall be maintained at the premises that details every person employed there in the role of security/door supervisor each time they are on duty. The log shall include the following details:-
- (i) SIA Licence Number and name of individual
  - (ii) Time they commenced and finished their period of duty, including a signed acknowledgement by that person.
  - (iii) The name of the Company who their services were engaged through.
- (28) The Log must be kept on the premises to which it relates and shall be made immediately available to Officers of the Responsible Authorities on request.
- (29) Only drinking vessels made from poly carbonate or plastic may be used to serve drinks at any time. No drinks are to be served to customers in glass bottles. In every case, they will be poured into appropriate vessels by bar staff.
- (30) The Premises Licence Holder shall operate and maintain in good working order, an electronic identification scanning system such as 'Scannet' or similar electronic document scanning device if commercially available.
- (31) All customers entering the premises shall be asked to produce photographic identification, such as a valid passport, valid driving licence or PASS card and agree to the said identification being used for scanning. Customers who do not agree to this, will be refused entry.
- (32) All identification provided by customers shall be scanned electronically.
- (33) The premises licence holder or venue representative will notify the Police Licensing Department responsible for the area in writing or by e-mail as soon as reasonably practicable if any issues arise in respect of the operation of the scanning system or the internet service accompanying it.

- (34) Details of persons banned at the venue are to be entered onto the device used by the venue and that information shared locally and nationally with other venues using the same or similar scanning system by way of the Information Technology System (internet protocol.)
