Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-
- (i) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (ii) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- (3)
- (i) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (ii) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (iii) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- (4) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. For the purposes of this condition –
- (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula –
$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where –
 - (i) P is the permitted price
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence –
 - (i) The holder of the premises licence
 - (ii) The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- (f) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) would (apart from the paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (g) Paragraph (b)(ii) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (h) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- (1)
 - (a) All staff / employees shall (before being permitted to make sales of alcohol) be given suitable and sufficient training in relation to the lawful sale of alcohol and the procedures adopted at the premises in respect of alcohol sales to a level commensurate with their role and responsibilities.
 - (b) Written records of staff training must be kept and made available to authorised officers upon request. These records must include the signature of the trainee to acknowledge the training has been understood.
 - (c) The above mentioned training must be repeated at regular intervals of not less than 2 years.
- (2) Suitable and sufficient warning signs shall be displayed in the premises providing general information as to the relevant age restrictions and offences for purchase of age-restricted products (including alcohol).
- (3)
 - (a) The duty manager is to be called in any instance where any person(s) appearing to be under the age of 21 years of age is attempting to purchase alcohol.
 - (b) The duty manager shall be trained to request and ensure sight of suitable identification (Passport, photo driving licence or PASS card), for proof of age, of any person appearing to them to be under the age of 21 (twenty-one) and who is attempting to purchase alcohol.
 - (c) Further to the above, the duty manager at the premises shall be instructed that no sale of alcohol shall be made unless suitable identification, for proof of age, can be provided.
- (4)
 - (a) A suitable and sufficient digital CCTV camera system linked to a suitable recording facility, which captures images of evidential quality, shall, so far as is reasonably practicable, be operational at the premises during any period in which licensable activities are permitted.
 - (b) The CCTV system shall incorporate cameras covering all areas of the premises that the public have access to including the checkouts, and the entrance / exit to the premises.
 - (c) CCTV recordings and footage must be retained for a minimum period of 28 (twenty-eight) days and be made available for immediate review by the Police, and copies provided within 48

hours of request (subject to the requirements of the Data Protection legislation in force at the time).

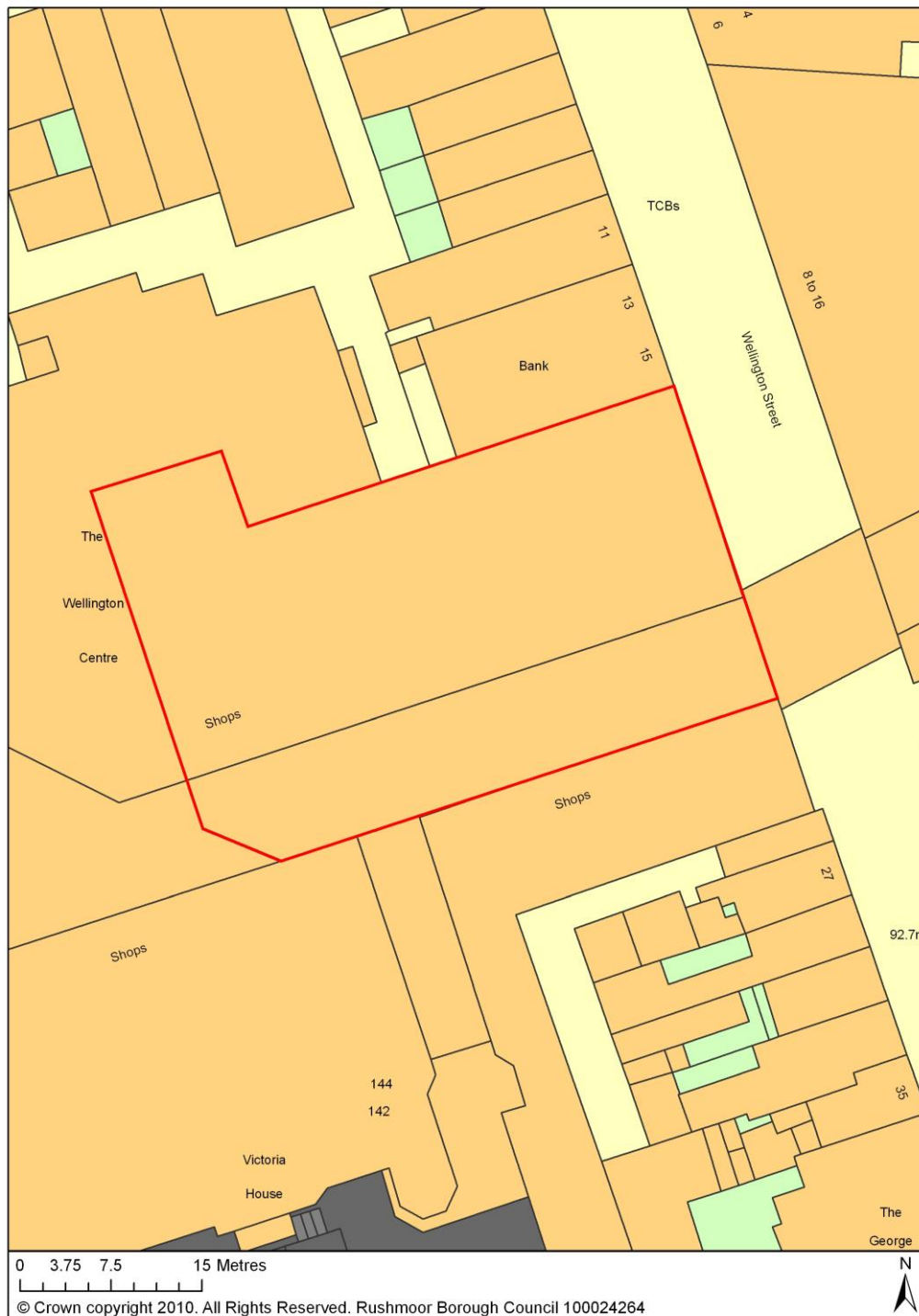
- (d) The CCTV system shall be stored and operated in a secure environment with limited access, to avoid damage, theft, unauthorised viewing and maintain the integrity of the system.
- (e) All CCTV recorded images / footage and copies thereof shall, so far as is reasonably practicable, display the correct time and date of each recording. The system clock shall be checked regularly for accuracy taking account of GMT and BST.
- (f) Any images recovered must be in a viewable format on either USB memory stick, disc or other appropriate format agreed with Hampshire Constabulary. Footage supplied in a digital format on CD or DVD will also have a copy of the CCTV system software enabled on the disc to allow playback.
- (g) Suitable and sufficient warning signs shall be displayed in the public areas of the premises advising that CCTV is in operation at the premises.
