Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-
 - (i) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (ii) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- (3)
 - (i) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (ii) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (4) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- (5) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. For the purposes of this condition –
 - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula –
$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where –

- (i) P is the permitted price
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence –
 - (i) The holder of the premises licence
 - (ii) The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- (f) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) would (apart from the paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (g) Paragraph (b)(ii) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (h) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- (1) All lighting, including external lighting and lights activated by sensors, shall be correctly adjusted so that it only illuminates the surface(s) intended and does not unreasonably throw light onto neighbouring property.
- (2) The area in the immediate vicinity of the premises shall be cleared of litter, including waste arising from smoking activities on a regular basis and always at the close of business.
- (3) A written log shall be kept of all refusals including refusals to serve alcohol. The holder of the premises licence shall ensure that the refusals log is properly maintained and this shall involve, but is not limited to, nominating in writing a responsible person to check and sign it on a weekly basis.
- (4) Suitable and sufficient warning signs shall be displayed in the premises providing information in respect of the below challenge 25 policy and the request for suitable identification in connection thereof.
- (5)
 - (i) A suitable and sufficient CCTV camera system linked to a suitable recording facility shall, so far as is reasonably practicable, be operational at the premises during any period in which licensable activities are permitted.
 - (ii) So far as is reasonably practicable, the CCTV system must be maintained in good working order at all times.
- (6) Anyone authorised to sell alcohol at the premises shall check and, where appropriate, challenge any prospective purchaser of alcohol as to whether they are making the purchase on behalf of a child.
- (7) All staff / employees shall be made aware of the conditions attached to this licence through a mechanism in writing.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

- (1) Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting patrons and staff to leave the premises and area quietly and not to loiter outside the premises.
- (2) All staff / employees shall (before being permitted to make sales of alcohol) be given suitable and sufficient training in relation to:
 - (i) The lawful sale of alcohol and the procedures adopted at the premises in respect of alcohol sales to a level commensurate with their role and responsibilities; and
 - (ii) Dealing with difficult and aggressive customers
 - (iii) Written records of such training shall be kept and made available to either the local authority or the licensing authority on request.
 - (iv) All training shall, where appropriate, be refreshed at three-monthly intervals.
- (3) Refrigeration units / chiller cabinets used for the display and storage of alcohol shall be of such design and construction as to facilitate secure storage when the sale of alcohol is not permitted.
- (4) The responsible person (as defined in section 153(4) of the Licensing Act 2003) of the premises shall (pro) actively participate in any local shop watch or centre watch scheme.
- (5) All staff shall, where appropriate, request and ensure sight of suitable identification of anyone appearing to them to be under the age of 25 and who is attempting to purchase alcohol and shall check any ID produced through use of an E+ card proof of age reader or other device which verifies the validity of the identification concerned.
- (6) Deliveries shall only be made to the premises between 08:00am and 18:00pm each day.
- (7) Prominent, clear and legible notices must be displayed on all alcohol display units advising of the times when alcohol is available / permitted to be sold.
- (8) A suitable panic alarm system shall be implemented and maintained at the premises for the use of staff in emergencies.
