## Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-
  - (i) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (ii) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- (3)
  - (i) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (ii) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
    - a. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
      - (a) a holographic mark, or
      - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- (4) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. For the purposes of this condition –
  - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
  - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula –
$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where –

- (i) P is the permitted price
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence –
  - (i) The holder of the premises licence
  - (ii) The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - (iii) The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- (f) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) would (apart from the paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (g) Paragraph (b)(ii) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (h) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

**Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule**

- (1) No licensable activities shall be undertaken except during permitted hours.
- (2)
  - (i) The holder of the premises licence shall ensure that every individual who appears to be under 21 years of age seeking to purchase or be supplied with alcohol at or from the premises shall produce suitable means of identification (passport, photo driving licence and PASS accredited photo ID only) proving that individual to be 18 years of age or older. If the person seeking alcohol is unable to produce acceptable means of identification, no sale or supply of alcohol will be made to or for that person.
  - (ii) All staff shall be suitably trained to a level commensurate with their role and responsibilities to challenge every individual who appears to be under 21 years of age and to refuse service where individuals cannot produce acceptable means of identification. Such training shall be provided not less than every six months, and written records shall be kept of all training and refresher training.
  - (iii) Suitable and sufficient warning signs shall be displayed in the premises advising customers that they may be requested to show suitable identification in relation to alcohol sales in line with the policies detailed in conditions 2(i) and 2(ii) above.
- (3)
  - (i) A written log shall be kept of all refusals of sale of age restricted products, including refusals to serve alcohol.
  - (ii) The holder of the premises licence shall ensure that the refusals log is properly maintained and this shall involve, but not be limited to, nominating in writing a responsible person to check and sign it on a weekly basis.
  - (iii) The licence holder, or person nominated in writing as per condition 3 (ii) above, shall (pro)actively monitor the sale of alcohol by staff to ensure that all alcohol sales are carried out in accordance with conditions 2 and 3 above
- (4)
  - (i) A suitable and sufficient CCTV camera system linked to a suitable recording facility shall, so far as is reasonably practicable, be operational at the premises during any period in which licensable activities are permitted.

- (ii) All CCTV recorded images and footage and copies thereof shall, so far as is reasonably practicable, be of evidential standard / quality and otherwise be regarded as identification standard and be made available to the police and other responsible authorities on request.
  - (iii) Suitable and sufficient signage informing patrons and staff of the presence of the CCTV system shall be displayed in prominent positions throughout the premises.
- (5)
- (i) All staff shall be trained to a level commensurate with their role and responsibility to ensure, so far as is reasonable practicable, [public] safety at the premises.
  - (ii) All internal furnishings, including, but not limited to, counters, tills and shelving shall be of such design and construction as to promote the health, safety and wellbeing of patrons and staff.
  - (iii) The premises shall be subject to suitable and regular maintenance and cleaning to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, [public] safety at all times.
- (6) The licence holder, or a suitable nominated representative, shall be actively involved in any community safety initiatives taking place within the vicinity of the premises.
