**Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions**

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-
  - (i) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (ii) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- (3) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (4) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
  - (i) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
    - (a) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
    - (b) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (ii) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (iii) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (iv) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise

- anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (v) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- (5) The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (6) (i) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (ii) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (iii) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- (7) The responsible person must ensure that—
- (i) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
- (a) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (b) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (c) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
- (ii) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

- (i) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.”
- (8) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises, for a price which is less than the permitted price.

**Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule**

- (1)
  - (i) A suitable and sufficient digital CCTV camera system linked to a suitable recording facility, which captures images of evidential quality, shall, so far as is reasonably practicable, be operational at the premises during any period in which licensable activities are permitted.
  - (ii) The CCTV system shall incorporate cameras covering both the internal areas of the premises and the external area immediately outside the front of the premises.
  - (ii) So far as is reasonably practicable, the CCTV system must be maintained to a standard acceptable to the relevant Police Licensing Department, in good working order at all times and shall be serviced at least every 12 months.
  - (iii) CCTV recordings and footage must be retained for a minimum period of 31 (thirty-one) days and be made available for review by the Police upon request (subject to the requirements of the Data Protection legislation in force at the time).
  - (iv) The CCTV system shall be stored and operated in a secure environment with limited access, to avoid damage, theft, unauthorised viewing and maintain the integrity of the system
  - (v) All CCTV recorded images / footage and copies thereof shall, so far as is reasonably practicable, display the correct time and date of each recording. The system clock shall be checked regularly for accuracy taking account of GMT and BST.
  - (vi) Suitable and sufficient warning signs shall be displayed in the public areas of the premises advising that CCTV is in operation at the premises.
  - (vii) A competent person conversant with the operation and retrieval of information contained in the CCTV system / footage shall be available to provide immediate copies of footage to the police on request. Any images recovered must be in a viewable format on either disc or VHS. Footage supplied in a digital format on CD or DVD will also have a copy of the CCTV system software enabled on the disc to allow playback.
  - (viii) A simple operator's manual shall be available at the premises to assist in replaying and exporting data from the CCTV system.
  - (ix) A written record shall be kept of any access made to the CCTV system, and shall be made available to the responsible authorities on request.

- (2)
  - (i) All staff / employees shall (before being permitted to make sales of alcohol) shall be given suitable and sufficient training in relation to the lawful sale of age-restricted products, their legal responsibilities and the procedures adopted at the premises in respect of attempts to purchase alcohol when unable to prove they are over the legal age.
  - (ii) Refresher training shall take place at least every 12 months.
  - (iii) Written records of all training signed by the staff member receiving the training, shall be kept and made available to the responsible authorities on request.
- (3) Alcohol shall only be sold;
  - (i) For consumption on the premises, where the patron consuming the alcohol is a bona fide customer consuming a substantial table meal purchased from the premises; or
  - (ii) For consumption off the premises, where it is purchased with a substantial takeaway meal.
- (4)
  - (i) Anyone authorised to sell or supply alcohol at the premises shall request and ensure sight of suitable identification, for proof of age, of any person appearing to them to be under the age of 25 (twenty-five) and who is attempting to purchase alcohol.
  - (ii) Further to the above, anyone authorised to sell or supply alcohol at the premises shall be instructed that no sale of alcohol shall be made unless suitable identification, for proof of age, can be provided.
  - (iii) A written age verification policy shall be produced and implemented at the premises, detailing the steps taken to prevent adults purchasing alcohol for consumption by people under the age of 18 years, and including the above "Challenge 25" policy.
- (5) Children under the age of 16 years shall not be permitted in the premises, unless they are accompanied by an adult (over 18 years).
- (6) Prominent, clear and legible notices must be displayed at all exits requesting patrons and staff to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
- (7) The area within the immediate vicinity of the premises shall be cleared of litter, including waste arising from smoking activities on a regular basis and always at the close of business each day.

- (8) Except for access and egress, all external doors and windows must be closed and kept closed at all times.
