Licensable activities authorised by the licence

- (1) The retail sale / supply of alcohol;
- (2) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of live music (limited to a maximum of two performers at any one time and to bona fide private functions), (including Karaoke), (indoors only);
- (3) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of recorded music (indoors only);
- (4) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of anything of a similar description to items (2) or (3) above (indoors only); and
- (5) The provision of late night refreshment (indoors only).

Times the licence authorises the carrying out of licensable activities

- (1) The retail sale / supply of alcohol, the provision of regulated entertainment by way of recorded music (and anything similar to live or recorded music),
 - Sunday to Wednesday – 10:00am to 00:00midnight;
 - Thursday to Saturday – 10:00am to 01:00am the following day;
 - On statutory Bank Holiday weekends (including the Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday thereof), Christmas Eve and the Thursday before Good Friday – 10:00am to 01:00am the following day;
 - On St. David's Day (1st March), St. Patrick's Day (17th March), St. George's Day (23rd April) and St. Andrew's Day (30th November), where formally notified to and agreed with Hampshire Constabulary at least 7 days prior any given event - one additional hour; and
 - On occasions of local, national or international significance or for charitable events, where formally notified to and agreed with Hampshire Constabulary at least 7 days prior to any given event - one additional hour.

- (2) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of live music (including Karaoke and anything of a similar description) – on any day - 10:00am to 23:00pm .
- (3) The provision of late night refreshment:-
 - Sunday to Wednesday – 23:00pm to 00:30am the following day;
 - Thursday to Saturday – 23:00pm to 01:30am the following day;
 - On statutory Bank Holiday weekends (including the Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday thereof), Christmas Eve and the Thursday before Good Friday – 23:00pm to 01:30am the following day;
 - On St. David's Day (1st March), St. Patrick's Day (17th March), St. George's Day (23rd April) and St. Andrew's Day (30th November), where formally notified to and agreed with Hampshire Constabulary at least 7 days prior any given event - one additional hour; and
 - On occasions of local, national or international significance or for charitable events, where formally notified to and agreed with Hampshire Constabulary at least 7 days prior to any given event - one additional hour.

The opening hours of the premises

- (1) Sunday's to Wednesday's – 09:00am to 00:30am the following day;
- (2) Thursday's to Saturday's – 09:00am to 01:30am the following day;
- (3) On statutory Bank Holiday weekends (including the Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday thereof), Christmas Eve and the Thursday before Good Friday – 09:00am to 01:30am the following day;
- (4) On St. David's Day (1st March), St. Patrick's Day (17th March), St. George's Day (23rd April) and St. Andrew's Day (30th November), where formally notified to and agreed with Hampshire Constabulary at least 7 days prior any given event - one additional hour; and
- (5) On occasions of local, national or international significance or for charitable events, where formally notified to and agreed with Hampshire Constabulary at least 7 days prior to any given event - one additional hour.

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-
 - (i) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (ii) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- (3)
 - (i) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (ii) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (iii) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- (4) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. For the purposes of this condition –
 - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula –
$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

Where –

- (i) P is the permitted price
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
 - (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence –
 - (i) The holder of the premises licence
 - (ii) The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
 - (f) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) would (apart from the paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
 - (g) Paragraph (b)(ii) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (h) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
- (5) (i) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (ii) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- (6) The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (7) The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- (1) No licensable activities shall be provided except during permitted hours.
- (2) Alcohol shall be sold and the premises shall be operated in accordance with the licence holder's policy and approach to responsible drinking.
- (3) A zero tolerance approach shall be taken towards the presence and use of illegal drugs on the premises. This policy shall be actively enforced at all times.
- (4) All instances of crime and disorder shall be reported to the police and shall be recorded in an incident log book kept on the premises.
- (5) All management and staff at the premises shall be equipped to promote the licensing objective regarding the promotion of public safety through formal training in company policies and procedures to a level commensurate with their duties and responsibilities.
- (6) Any entertainment provided during a time when children are permitted in/on the premises shall be suitable in nature and content as not to cause harm thereto.
- (7) Children not supervised by an accompanying individual aged 18 or over shall not be permitted in or to remain on the premises at any time.
- (8) Suitable and sufficient supplies of first aid equipment / materials must be made available to members of the public on request. Dependant on the activities, events and risks at the premises, a suitably trained first aider or an appointed person for first aid must also be present on the premises at all times during licensable activities.
- (9) Except for access and egress, all external doors and windows must be closed and kept closed between 23:00pm and the end of the specified opening hours on any day.
- (10)
 - (i) No music or speech shall be relayed via external speakers, other than for events with the prior approval of the licensing authority.
 - (ii) Except where approved in accordance with the above, all speakers and other such amplification equipment shall be kept within the premises.
 - (iii) Except where otherwise approved in accordance with the above, speakers and other such amplification equipment shall not be positioned near to or facing openings such as doors and windows.

- (11) (i) Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be suitably located on all exit doors of the licensed premises requesting patrons and staff to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
- (ii) On occasions where the provision of regulated entertainment involves the use of a disc jockey, the disc jockey shall actively remind customers to leave the premises and local area quietly at the end of the given entertainment.
- (12) (i) The licence holder or nominated representative(s) shall carry out a regular noise assessment of the area adjacent to the premises whilst licensable activities take place.
- (ii) Noise assessments shall take place on all sides of the premises at the boundary of the nearest residential premises, and if audible, steps shall be taken to reduce noise from the premises to a level where noise is no longer audible at the monitoring points.
- (iii) These assessments shall be undertaken at hourly intervals from 23:00pm.
- (iv) Written records of these assessments and any remedial action(s) taken shall be kept and made available to either the local authority or the Licensing Authority when requested.
- (13) (i) A suitable noise complaints procedure must be established and in operation at the premises (e.g. all staff must be familiar with the complaints procedure and any complaint(s) made in respect of the premises, its customers, staff and/or the activities carried on there must be investigated and remedied as soon as, and, so far as is reasonably practicable to prevent public nuisance).
- (ii) Suitable written records (e.g. the nature of any complaint(s), action(s) taken in response, the date(s) and time(s) when any complaint was made, together with the name of the person(s) who handled the complaint) must be kept and made available to officers of Rushmoor Borough Council on request.
- (14) Disposal of refuse such as waste bottles into external receptacles, where the noise may be audible to neighbouring properties, shall not occur between 23:00pm and 08:00am.
- (15) (i) All lighting, including external lighting and lights activated by sensors, shall be correctly adjusted so that it only illuminates the surface(s) intended and does not unreasonably throw light onto neighbouring properties.

- (ii) All external lights shall be turned off when the premises are not being used to provide licensable activities or are otherwise in use.
- (16) Customer toilets shall be checked at hourly intervals and cleaned as necessary.
- (17) All employees and staff shall be made aware of the conditions of this licence by a mechanism in writing.

Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

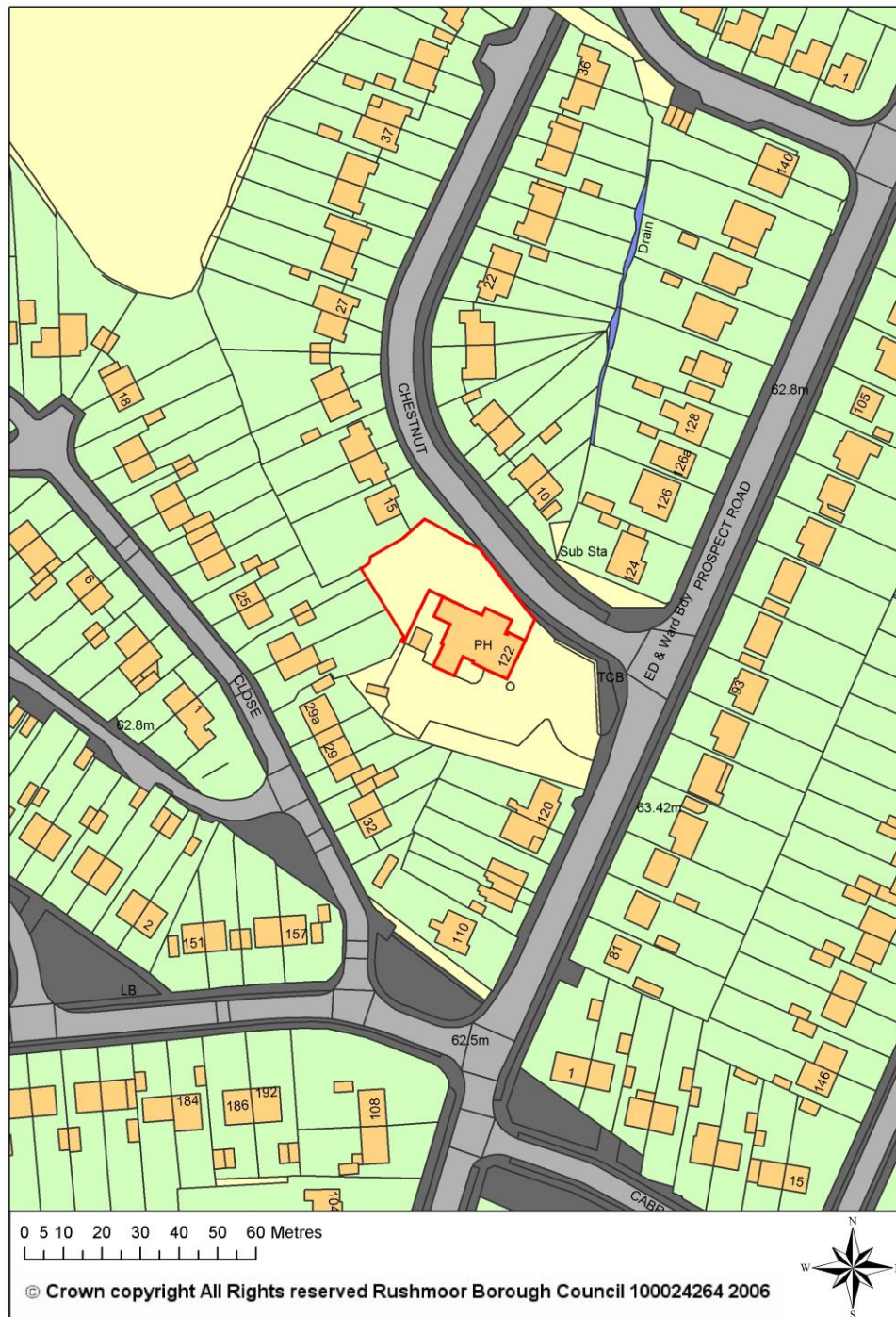
- (1) Any garden and external drinking areas shall be closed for licensable activities and the consumption of food and drink (including alcohol) after 23:00pm on any day.
- (2) Any garden and external drinking areas shall be closed and vacated as follows:
 - (i) Between 23:00 hours and the end of specified opening hours on any Sunday
 - (ii) Between 23:30 hours and the end of specified opening hours Monday's to Saturday's inclusive

In each case, exiting patrons shall be asked to leave quietly.

- (3) Suitable and sufficient signs shall be erected and maintained on the premises and in the external drinking areas, advising of the closure and closing times of the external drinking areas as detailed above.
- (4) Suitable and sufficient litterbins shall be provided in the external drinking areas, and shall be emptied on a regular basis.
