  - Friday and Saturday - 11:00am to 23:59pm; and
  - On Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, New Year's Eve, New Year's Day and Nepalese New Year's Eve & New Year's Day – from the start of permitted hours until 01:00am the following day.
- (2) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of recorded music:-
  - Sunday to Thursday - 11:00am to 23:30pm;
  - Friday and Saturday - 11:00am to 00:00midnight; and
  - On Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, New Year's Eve, New Year's Day and Nepalese New Year's Eve & New Year's Day – from the start of permitted

hours until 01:00am the following day.

- (3) The provision of late night refreshment(s):-
- Sunday to Thursday - 23:00pm to 23:30pm;
  - Friday and Saturday - 23:00pm to 23:59pm; and
  - On Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, New Year's Eve, New Year's Day and Nepalese New Year's Eve & New Year's Day – from the start of permitted hours until 01:00am the following day.

### The opening hours of the premises

- Sunday to Thursday - 12:00noon to 00:00midnight;
- Friday and Saturday - 12:00noon to 00:30am the following day; and
- On Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, New Year's Eve, New Year's Day and Nepalese New Year's Eve & New Year's Day – from the start of permitted hours until 01:30am the following day.

**Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions**

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-
  - (i) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (ii) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- (3) (i) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (ii) For the purposes of this condition, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children –
    - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to –
      - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
      - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
    - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
    - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
    - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on –

- (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process,  
or
  - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- (4) The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- (5) The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (6) (i) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (ii) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- (7) The responsible person shall ensure that –
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures –
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
  - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
  - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.
- (8) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

**Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule**

- (1) All external doors/windows must be kept closed, other than during access and egress after 22:00 hrs
- (2) All speakers must be kept within the premises and shall not be positioned near to or facing openings such as doors or windows. Speakers shall be placed on anti-vibration mounts. No speakers shall be permitted on the first and second floors.
- (3) The sound level of the music shall be set either:
  - (a) At a level which does not interfere with the average person's conversation in the premises (background music): or
  - (b) At a level agreed in writing with Environmental Health Services at Rushmoor Borough Council.
- (4) Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting patrons and staff to leave the premises and area quietly.
- (5) Procedures for responding to noise complaints shall be established. Written records of noise complaints and action taken in response shall be kept and made available to officers from Rushmoor Borough Council when requested.
- (6) Disposal of refuse such as waste bottles into external receptacles where the noise will be audible to neighbouring properties must not occur between 2300 and 0800 hrs.
- (7) The area in the immediate vicinity of the premises shall be cleared of litter, including waste arising from smoking activities on a regular basis and always at the close of business.
- (8)
  - (i) Anyone authorised to sell or supply alcohol at the premises shall request and ensure sight of suitable identification, for proof of age, of any person appearing to them to be under the age of 25 (twenty-five) and who is attempting to purchase alcohol.
  - (ii) Further to the above, anyone authorised to sell or supply alcohol at the premises shall be instructed that no sale of alcohol shall be made unless suitable identification, for proof of age, can be provided.
  - (iii) Suitable and sufficient warning signs shall be displayed in the premises providing information in respect of the above challenge 25 policy and the request for suitable identification in connection thereof.

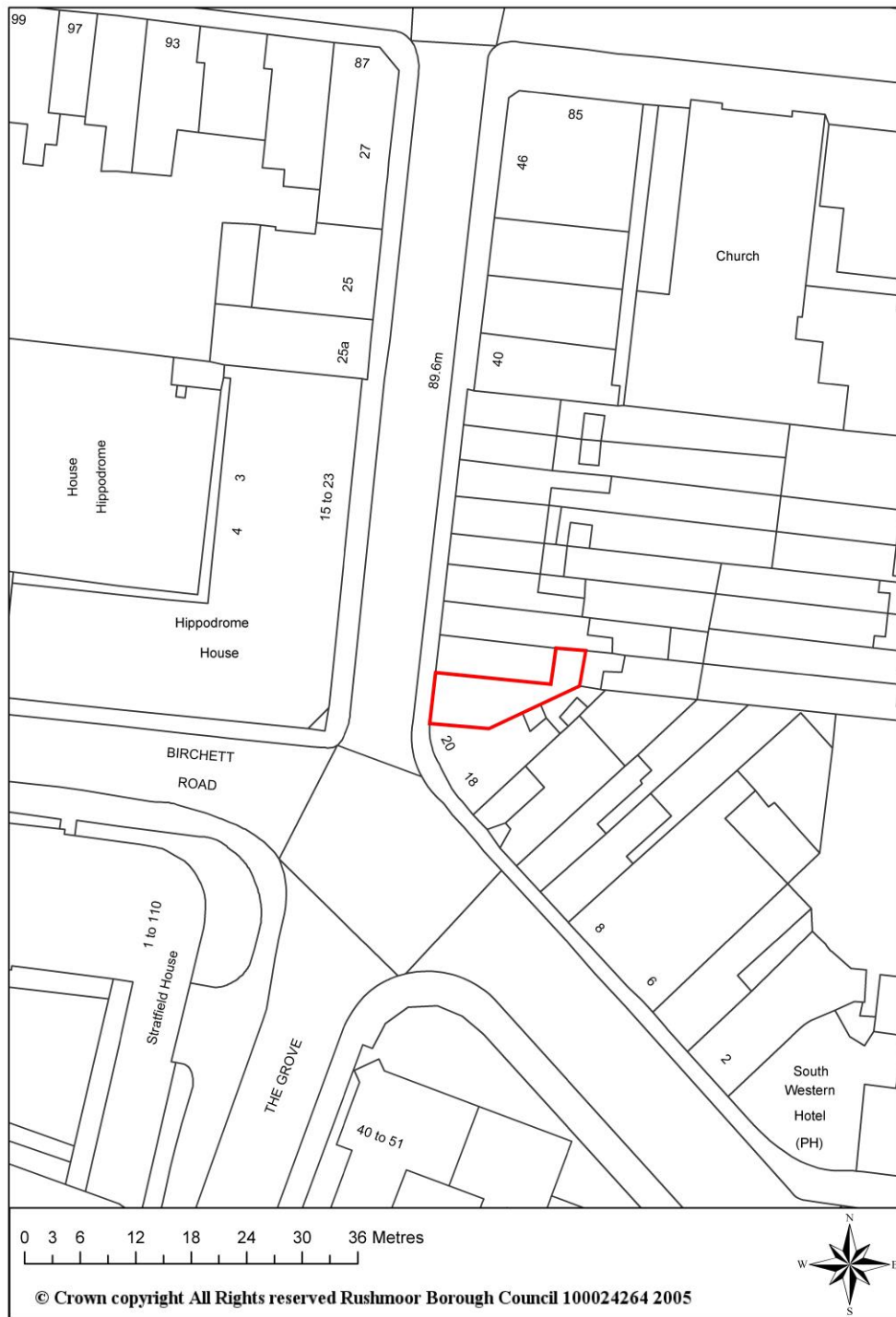
- (9) No children under the age of 16 years, shall be permitted to remain in the premises after 22:00pm on any day.
- (10) All staff will be made aware of the conditions of the licence. This is to be made in writing.
