- (1) The retail sale / supply of alcohol;
- (2) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of recorded music;
- (3) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of live music; and
- (4) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of performances of dance (indoors only).

- (1) The retail sale / supply of alcohol:-
 - Sundays to Thursdays – 11:00am to 23:00pm;
 - Fridays and Saturdays – 11:00am to 00:00midnight;
 - On Christmas Eve (24th December) – 11:00am to 00:00midnight;
 - On New Years Eve (31st December) – 11:00am to 01:00am the following day;
 - On Good Friday – 12:00pm to 22:30pm; and
 - On Christmas Day (25th December) – a maximum of 6 hours between 12:00pm & 15:00pm and 17:00pm & 22:30pm
- (2) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of live music:-
 - Sundays to Thursdays – 11:00am to 23:00pm; and
 - Fridays and Saturdays – 11:00am to 23:30pm
- (3) All other licensable activities:-
 - Sundays to Thursdays – 11:00am to 23:00pm;
 - Fridays and Saturdays – 11:00am to 23:30pm; and
 - On New Years Eve (31st December) – 11:00am to 01:00am the following day

The opening hours of the premises

- Sundays to Thursdays – 11:00am to 23:00pm;
- Fridays, Saturdays & Christmas Eve (24th December) - 11:00am to 00:00midnight; and
- On New Years Eve (31st December) – 11:00am to 01:00am the following day

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-
 - (i) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (ii) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- (3)
 - (i) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (ii) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (4) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- (5) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. For the purposes of this condition –
 - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula –
$$P = D + (D \times V)$$
Where –
 - (i) P is the permitted price
 - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence –
 - (i) The holder of the premises licence
 - (ii) The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- (f) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) would (apart from the paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (g) Paragraph (b)(ii) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (h) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
- (6) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (7) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
- (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- (8) The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (9) The responsible person must ensure that—
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
- (10) Where, at any specified time(s), one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity (within the meaning of the Private Security Industry Act 2001), each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority (SIA).

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- (1) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of live or recorded music provided outdoors shall be restricted to five events per calendar year. A written record of these events shall be kept at the premises and made available to the responsible authorities on request.
- (2) No regulated entertainment shall take place outdoors after 21:00 hours on any day.
- (3) At any time whilst regulated entertainment is taking place, the licence holder or a nominated representative shall carry out a noise assessment at a minimum of hourly intervals. Noise assessments should be carried out at the boundary of the nearest residential premises on each side of the premises, and if likely to cause a nuisance, steps should be taken to reduce the noise. Written records of these assessments, and any action taken shall be kept at the premises and made available to the responsible authorities on request.
- (4) The external patio area shall be closed to customers from 23:00pm on any day.
- (5) Except for access and egress, all external doors and windows must be closed and kept closed between 22:30pm and the end of opening hours on any day.
- (6) Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits of the premises requesting patrons and staff to respect the needs of local residents, to dispose of waste and to leave the premises and area quietly.
- (7) Disposal of refuse such as waste bottles into external receptacles, where the noise will be audible to neighbouring properties, must not occur between 22:00pm and 08:00am.
- (8) Suitable and sufficient litterbins shall be provided in the vicinity of the premises (including suitable receptacles to dispose of litter arising from smoking activities).
- (9) All lighting (including external lighting) shall be correctly adjusted so that it only illuminates the surface(s) intended and does not throw light onto or into neighbouring property.
- (10) During outdoor events only drinking vessels made from polycarbonate or plastic may be used to serve drinks to customers at the premises.
- (11) Suitable and sufficient staff, including managers, shall be present when licensable activities are taking place to encourage responsible behaviour on the premises at all times.

- (12) (i) Anyone authorised to sell alcohol at the premises shall (before being permitted to make sales of alcohol) be suitably trained in respect of the following matters to a level commensurate with their duties and responsibilities:-
- the refusal of the sale of alcohol to those who appear intoxicated and how to recognise them;
 - the appropriate precautions to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons under the age of 18, including the below Challenge 25 policy;
 - conflict resolution; and
 - incident management
- (ii) Refresher training shall take place at least every 6 months.
- (iii) Written records of such training shall be produced and be signed and dated by the member of staff receiving the training. They shall be kept on the premises to which they relate for a minimum of 2 years and be made available to the responsible authorities immediately on request.
- (13) (i) Anyone authorised to sell or supply alcohol at the premises shall request and ensure sight of suitable identification, for proof of age, of any person appearing to them to be under the age of 25 (twenty-five) and who is attempting to purchase alcohol.
- (ii) For the purposes of this condition, suitable identification is photo driving licence, passport, or any other photographic identification bearing the "PASS" logo and the person's date of birth.
- (iii) Further to the above, anyone authorised to sell or supply alcohol at the premises shall be instructed that no sale of alcohol shall be made unless suitable identification, for proof of age, can be provided.
- (iv) Suitable and sufficient warning signs shall be displayed in the premises providing information in respect of the above challenge 25 policy and the request for suitable identification in connection thereof.
- (14) A designated area away from the main bar dispensing area shall be provided for children under the age of 18 to purchase sweets and soft drinks.

- (15) No advertising materials shall be displayed in the premises which contain obscene images.
- (16) For any event involving licensable activities, a suitable and sufficiently comprehensive Event Management Plan shall be developed, implemented and submitted to the licensing authority at least 8 (eight) weeks prior to the first day on which the event is due to commence.
- (17) For any event or private function a written risk assessment shall be produced and made available to the responsible authorities on request detailing the appropriate number of SIA door supervisors.
- (18) Suitable written policies on noise management, and how the venue will deal with drugs, complaints and conduct issues shall be developed for the premises. These policies shall be actively implemented and enforced at the premises and shall be reviewed, revised and updated as often as may be necessary.
- (19) A written incident log shall be kept and maintained at the premises and should contain details of any incident. The log shall be made available to the police immediately on request.
- (20)
 - (i) A suitable and sufficient CCTV camera system linked to a suitable recording facility, which captures images of evidential quality, shall be operational at the premises during any period in which licensable activities are permitted.
 - (ii) The CCTV system shall incorporate cameras covering both the internal areas of the premises and the external area immediately outside the front, side and rear of the premises.
 - (iii) CCTV recordings and footage must be retained for a minimum period of 21 (twenty-one) days and be made available for review by the Police upon request (subject to the requirements of the Data Protection legislation in force at the time).
 - (iv) All CCTV recorded images and footage and copies thereof shall display the correct time and date of each recording. The system clock shall be checked regularly for accuracy taking account of GMT and BST.
