- (8) On Christmas Day 12:00noon to 15:00pm and 19:00pm to 22:30pm.
- (9) On New Years Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Years Eve to the start of permitted hours on the following day (or, if there are no permitted hours on the following day, midnight on 31st December).

### **Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions**

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-
  - (i) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (ii) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- (3) (i) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
  - (ii) For the purposes of this condition, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children
    - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to
      - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
      - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
    - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
    - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
    - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on –



- (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
- (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- (4) The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- (5) The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (6) (i) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (ii) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- (7) The responsible person shall ensure that
  - (a)where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures
    - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
  - (b)customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.
- (8) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.



## Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- (2) Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.
- (3) The above restriction does not prohibit:-
  - (i) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the consumption of the alcohol on the premises:
  - (ii) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
  - (iii) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
  - (iv) consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
  - (v) the ordering of alcohol to be consumed off the premises, or despatch by the vendor of the alcohol so ordered;
  - (vi) the sale of alcohol to a trader or club for the purposes of the trade or club:
  - (vii) the sale or supply of alcohol to any canteen or mess, being a canteen in which the sale of supply of alcohol is carried out by the authority of the Secretary of State or an authorised mess of members of Her Majesty's naval, military or air forces;
  - (viii) the taking of alcohol from the premises by a person residing there; or
  - (ix) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to any private friends of a person residing there who are bona fide entertained by him at his own expense, or the consumption of alcohol by persons so supplied; or
  - (x) the supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the holder of the licence, or the consumption of the liquor so supplied, if the liquor is supplied at the expense of their employer or of the person carrying on or in charge of the business on the premises.



- (4) All persons under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult at all times and must vacate the Premises by 21:00.
- (5) Where the number of children attending a permitted entertainment exceeds one hundred (100) (including circumstances where the premises is permitted to be used, for hire or reward for the purpose of a permitted entertainment, the person providing the entertainment must station and keep stationed a sufficient number of adult attendants, properly instructed as to their duties, to prevent more children or other persons being admitted to the premises or to any part thereof, than the premises can properly accommodate, and to control the movement of the children and other persons so admitted while entering and leaving the premises or any part thereof, and to take all other reasonable precautions for the safety of the children.
- (6) At any time where regulated entertainment is taking place in the external garden area of the premises, the DPS or a nominated representative shall carry out regular checks of the area to ensure the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- (7) Prominent, clear and legible notices shall be displayed at all exits of the premises requesting patrons and staff to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
- (8) Except for access and egress, all external doors and windows must be closed and kept closed at all times when regulated entertainment is being provided indoors.
- (9) (i) All staff / employees shall be trained regarding appropriate precautions to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons under the age of 18, the below Challenge 25 policy, the signs and symptoms of intoxicated persons and the refusal of sale due to intoxication.
  - (ii) Written records of such training shall be produced, and be signed and dated by the member of staff receiving the training. They shall be kept on the premises to which they relate for a minimum of 2 years and be made available to the responsible authorities immediately on request.
- (10) (i) Anyone authorised to sell or supply alcohol at the premises shall request and ensure sight of suitable identification, for proof of age, of any person appearing to them to be under the age of 25 (twenty-five) and who is attempting to purchase alcohol.
  - (ii) For the purposes of this condition, suitable identification is photo driving licence, passport, or any other photographic identification bearing the "PASS" logo and the person's date of birth.



- (iii) Further to the above, anyone authorised to sell or supply alcohol at the premises shall be instructed that no sale of alcohol shall be made unless suitable identification, for proof of age, can be provided.
- (iv) Suitable and sufficient warning signs shall be displayed in the premises providing information in respect of the above challenge 25 policy and the request for suitable identification in connection thereof.
- (11) A written incident log shall be kept and maintained at the premises, and should contain details of the following:
  - (a) All refusals of entry to the premises, including the reason for the refusal and any refusal to serve alcohol (i.e. intoxicated or no identification); and
  - (b) All ejections from the venue, including a summary of the circumstances leading to the ejection, and details of all staff members involved.
