#### Licensable activities authorised by the licence

- (1) The retail sale / supply of alcohol;
- (2) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of the exhibition of film(s) (indoor only);
- (3) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of indoor sporting events (limited to darts, dominoes, pool, snooker and other minor sporting games of a similar nature);
- (4) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of recorded music (**NB:** this only permits background recorded music and does **NOT** permit the use of Karaoke, Comperses etc); and
- (5) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of karaoke and recorded music; and
- (6) The provision of late-night refreshment (indoors and outdoors).

#### Times the licence authorises the carrying out of licensable activities

- (1) The retail sale / supply of alcohol, the provision of regulated entertainment by way of the exhibition of film(s) or the provision of indoor sporting events and the provision of late night refreshment:-

  - On May Bank Holiday weekends (1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>) and August Bank Holiday weekend (the Monday thereof) - one additional hour;
  - On Christmas Eve (24<sup>th</sup> December), Boxing Day (26<sup>th</sup> December), the 27<sup>th</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup>, and 30<sup>th</sup> December – two additional hours;
  - On New Year's Eve from the end of permitted hours on New Year's Eve to the start of permitted hours on New Year's Day; and
  - An additional hour to the standard and non-standard timings on the day when British Summertime commences;
  - In the event of a recognized event (not exceeding 12 annually) which falls outside of the permitted hours detailed above, and subject to ten (10) days-notice thereof (before the day on which the event takes place) to the relevant licensing authority, and similar notice and consent of the local police - one hour before the commencement of the event to one hour after the end of the event.
- (2) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of recorded music – without limitation.
- (3) The provision of regulated entertainment by way of karaoke and recorded music:-
- Sundays to Wednesdays 18:00pm to 00:00am
  - Thursdays to Saturdays 18:00pm – 01:00am (on the following day)

### **The opening hours of the premises**

- (1) Sundays to Wednesdays - 09:00am to 00:30am the following day;
- (2) Thursdays – 09:00am to 01:30am the following day;
- (3) Fridays and Saturdays – 10:00am to 03:30am the following day;
- On St. David's Day (1<sup>st</sup> March) – one additional hour;
  - On St. Patrick's Day (17<sup>th</sup> March) and Halloween – two additional hours;
  - On Easter Bank Holiday weekend (the Sunday and Monday thereof) - one additional hour;
  - On May Bank Holiday weekends (1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>) and August Bank Holiday weekend (the Sunday thereof) - two additional hours;

- (3) In the event of a recognized event (not exceeding 12 annually) which falls outside of the permitted hours detailed in (1) and (2) above, and subject to ten (10) days' notice thereof (before the day on which the event takes place) to the relevant licensing authority, and similar notice and consent of the local police - one hour before the commencement of the event to one hour after the end of the event.

**Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions**

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-
  - (i) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (ii) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- (3)
  - (i) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (ii) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (4) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
  - (a) a holographic mark, or
  - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- (5) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. For the purposes of this condition –
  - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
  - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula –
$$P = D + (D \times V)$$
Where –
    - (i) P is the permitted price

- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
  - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence –
- (i) The holder of the premises licence
  - (ii) The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - (iii) The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- (f) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) would (apart from the paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (g) Paragraph (b)(ii) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (h) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
- (6) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (7) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
    - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
    - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
  - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- (8) The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (9) The responsible person must ensure that—
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
    - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
  - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
- (10) Where, at any specified time(s), one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity (within the meaning of the Private Security Industry Act 2001), each individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority (SIA).
- (11) (i) In respect of the exhibition of films, the admission of children (ie: anyone aged under 18) must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation(s) made by the film classification body specified (as designated by S4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 - the British Board of Film Classification).
- (ii) Where a film classification body is not specified, the admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation(s) made by the licensing authority.

**Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule**

- (1) There must be a minimum of 2 licensed door supervisors on duty on Fridays and Saturdays from 2200 hrs until close, at times other than this the number of licensed door supervisors shall be determined on a risk assessment basis, or on advice from Police.
- (2) Except for access and egress, all external doors and windows must be closed and kept closed between 20:00pm and the end of opening hours at any time when regulated entertainment in the form of live or DJ led recorded music is taking place.
- (3) Sound amplification systems shall be played through a sound limiting device. The sound level output of any sound limiting device shall be set at a level that ensures that noise from the premises is just barely audible at the boundary of the nearest residential premises on all sides of the licensed premises.
- (4)
  - (i) The Licence Holder or a nominated representative shall carry out a regular noise assessment of the area adjacent to the premises at the boundary of the nearest residential premises. Steps shall be taken to reduce noise from the public house to a level where noise from the premises is just barely audible at the monitoring points.(ii) The above assessments shall be undertaken at hourly intervals starting from 22:00pm, where regulated entertainment is taking place in the form of live or DJ led recorded music.
  - (ii) Written records of these assessments and any remedial actions shall be kept and made available to the Licensing Authority when requested.
- (5) The external drinking area / gardens shall be available only for the use of smokers between 22:00pm and the end of opening hours. No licensable activities nor the consumption of alcohol or other drinks shall take place within the external areas during this time. Patrons shall be asked to leave the area quietly.
- (6) A suitable and sufficient CCTV system shall be installed at the premises and maintained in good working order and used at all times when the premises are open for licensable activities. The CCTV system will be of evidential quality and record continuously. Any CCTV footage shall be held for at least 28 days and shall be made available to an Officer of the Licensing Authority or Police on reasonable request (subject to the data protection requirements in force at the time).
- (7) Where Pubwatch exists covering the area of which the premises is situated then the DPS or other nominated employee shall participate in Pubwatch.



- (8) The premises shall maintain a written drugs policy, which shall be made available to the Police or an authorised officer of the Council upon request.
- (9) An incident log book (which may be electronic) shall be kept on the premises and made available on request to an authorised officer of the Council or Police which will record the following:
  - (a) Any incidents of disorder
  - (b) Any seizures of drugs or offensive weapons
  - (c) Any ejections of patrons
- (10) The premises shall maintain a written dispersal policy, which shall be made available to the Police or an authorised officer of the Council upon request.
- (11) On Fridays and Saturdays from 21:00 hours until close of business, only drinking vessels made from polycarbonate or plastic may be used to serve drinks to customers at the premises, with the exception of bottled products served in the bottle, wine, champagne, prosecco and spirits which may be served in glass vessels. On Fridays and Saturdays from 22:00 hours until close of business, no consumption of drinks (with the exception of bottled products served in the bottle, wine, champagne, prosecco and spirits) shall take place from glass vessels.
- (12) Reasonable steps shall be taken to recognise the rights of local residents and notices shall be displayed at the premises exits requesting customers to leave quietly and reminding them that they are in a residential area.
- (13)
  - (i) Anyone authorised to sell or supply alcohol at the premises shall request and ensure sight of suitable identification, for proof of age, of any person appearing to them to be under the age of 25 (twenty-five) and who is attempting to purchase alcohol. For the purposes of this condition, suitable identification is photo driving licence, passport, or any other photographic identification bearing the "PASS" logo and the person's date of birth.
  - (ii) Further to the above, anyone authorised to sell or supply alcohol at the premises shall be instructed that no sale of alcohol shall be made unless suitable identification, for proof of age, can be provided.
  - (iii) Suitable and sufficient warning signs shall be displayed in the premises providing information in respect of the above challenge 25

policy and the request for suitable identification in connection thereof.

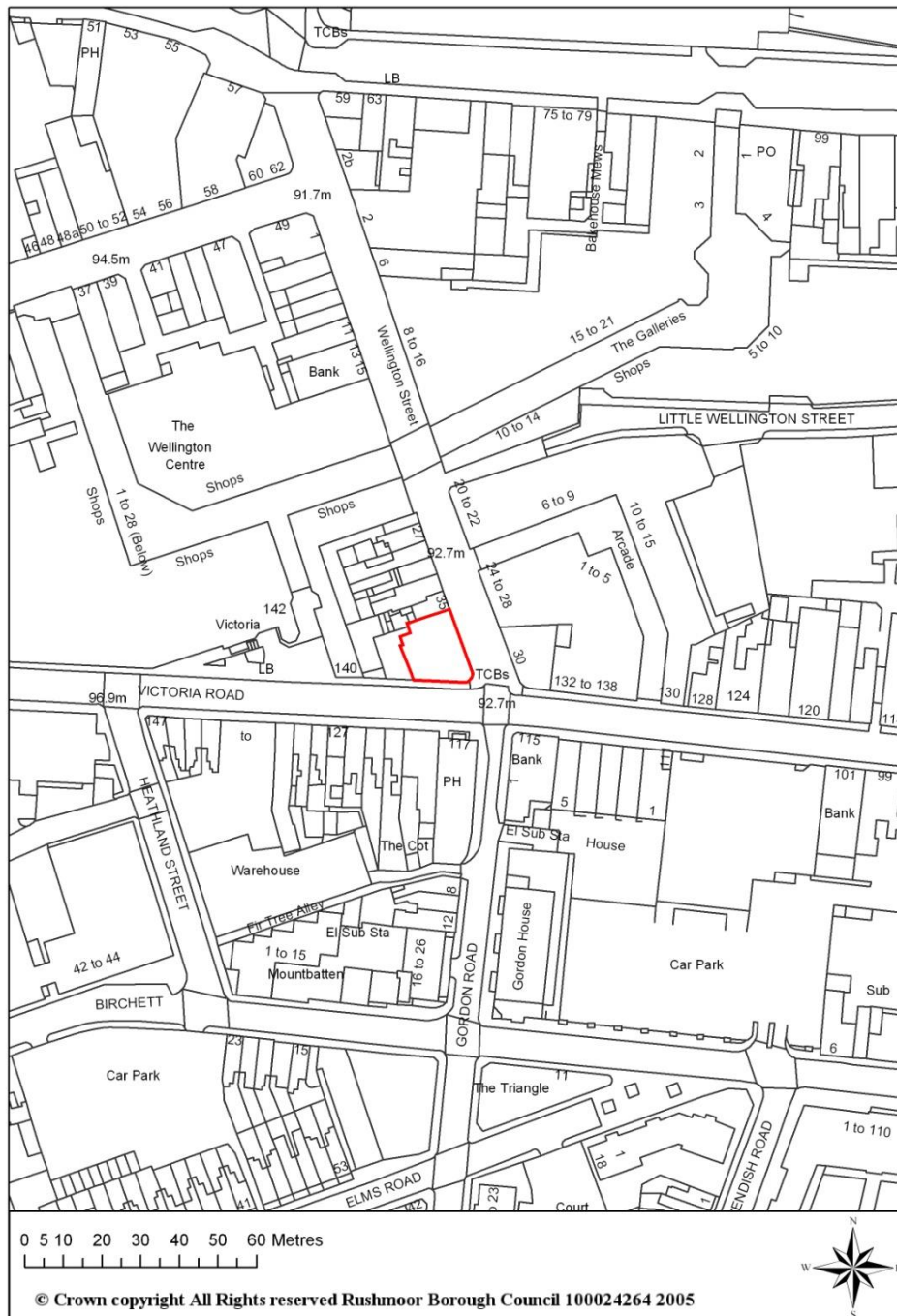
- (14) A log (which may be electronic) shall be kept detailing all refused sales of alcohol. The log shall include the date and time of the refusal and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale. A copy of the log or electronic report shall be made available to an authorised Police Officer and Licensing Authority Officer upon request.
- (15) All bar staff shall receive appropriate training in relation to alcohol sales prior to commencing their duties. This will include the premises licence conditions, underage sales policy and other relevant licensing matters. Training documents (which may be in an electronic format) shall be made available to an authorised Police Officer and Licensing Authority Officer upon request.
