**Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions**

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:-
  - (i) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (ii) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his/her personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- (3) The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- (4) The responsible person must ensure that—
  - (i) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
    - (a) beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - (b) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (c) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
  - (ii) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
  - (iii) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
- (5) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises, for a price which is less than the permitted price.

**Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule**

- (1) Intoxicating liquor may be supplied on the premises only to persons who are taking table meals there and as an ancillary to that meal.
- (2) Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied except during permitted hours.
- (3) The above restriction does not prohibit:-
  - (i) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the consumption of the alcohol on the premises:
  - (ii) during the first twenty minutes after the above hours, the taking of the alcohol from the premises unless the alcohol is supplied or taken in an open vessel;
  - (iii) during the first thirty minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking meals there if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals;
  - (iv) consumption of the alcohol on the premises or the taking of sale or supply of alcohol to any person residing in the licensed premises;
- (4) Suitable beverages other than intoxicating liquor (incl. Drinking water) shall be equally available for consumption with or otherwise as an ancillary to meals served in the licensed premises.
- (5) The premises must be bona fide used for the purpose of habitually providing the customary main meal at midday or in the evening, or both, for the accommodation of persons frequenting the premises.
- (6) Anyone authorised to sell alcohol at the premises (before being permitted to make sales of alcohol) be suitably trained in respect of the following matters to a level commensurate with their duties and responsibilities
  - (a) the refusal of the sale of alcohol to those who appear intoxicated and how to recognise them; and
  - (b) the appropriate precautions to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons under the age of 18.
- (7) Refresher training shall take place at least every 12 months
- (8) All staff / employees shall be trained regarding appropriate precautions to prevent the sale of alcohol to persons under the age of 18, the below Challenge 25 policy, the signs and symptoms of intoxicated persons and the refusal of sale due to intoxication.

- (9) Anyone authorised to sell or supply alcohol at the premises shall request and ensure sight of suitable identification, for proof of age, of any person appearing to them to be under the age of 25 (twenty-five) and who is attempting to purchase alcohol.
- (i) For the purposes of this condition, suitable identification is photo driving licence, passport, or any other photographic identification bearing the "PASS" logo and the person's date of birth.
- (ii) Further to the above, anyone authorised to sell or supply alcohol at the premises shall be instructed that no sale of alcohol shall be made unless suitable identification, for proof of age, can be provided.
- (iii) Suitable and sufficient warning signs shall be displayed in the premises providing information in respect of the above challenge 25 policy and the request for suitable identification in connection thereof.
- (10) Alcohol shall only be delivered to a legitimate address that is a dwelling or business premises.
- (11) The delivery driver shall ensure that for every transaction including alcohol which has not been pre-paid for by credit card, that photographic ID proving that person to be over the age of 18 years is produced.
- (12) The delivery driver shall record in writing or electronically:
- The date of birth
  - The passport number and/or
  - Photo driving licence number, and/or
  - PASS accredited photo ID number

These details shall be corroborated with the original order for alcohol. If the person seeking alcohol is unable to produce acceptable means of identification, or the details cannot be corroborated with the original order, no sale or supply of alcohol will be made to or for that person. These records shall be made available to responsible authorities on request.

- (13) Further to the above all alcohol shall be left in the delivery vehicle until the above identity criteria have been met.
